As per the public announcement to HEIs Dt.10th February 2025, the Peer Team visits to HEIs will be conducted in online mode only. NAAC is planning to complete all the pending visits by 15th May 2025.

Standard Operating Procedure /NAAC Guidelines to HEIs for the Online Peer Team Visit (Affiliated College)

- 1. The HEI will be requested to provide 3 sets of dates for the conduct of Virtual Peer team Visit. One set of date from the suggested three sets will be chosen and no date change will be allowed there from.
- 2. The details of the Peer Team will be known to the HEIs only on the dates of the visit.
- 3. Visit will be scheduled between 9:30 AM and 5:30PM on both days.
- 4. The Video camera (virtual meet) of the HEI and Peer team Members must be always switched on during the scheduled Peer Team online visit.
- 5. HEI can only present data/input and relevant/supporting documents which were part of SSR (Qualitative Metrics QIM) for the assessment period.
- 6. On request by the peer team members, the HEI can show additional and relevant documents in support for relevant metrics, if any, as per claims made in the SSR (Qualitative Metrics QIM) for the assessment period only.
- 7. During the virtual visit, the HEI should show live video captured through Camera with GPS/location enabled as per the instruction of the Peer team.
- 8. HEIs are strictly not allowed to contact the Peer Team or NAAC officials except during the visit for any technical assistance.
- 9. The institution has to make all arrangement for technical / operational requirements for the online visit before the commencement of the visit. (power back-up, on-line video sharing, required internet band width etc)
- 10. The draft Peer Team Report will be shared to the Head of the institution by email of Chairperson before the closure of visit. Subsequently, a 15 minutes discussion will be scheduled where the Head of Institution, IQAC Coordinator and the Peer team discuss on the report for factual correctness of the finalised report by email.
- 11. HEIs should refrain from providing undue facilities or gifts (in cash or kind via any medium) to the peer team members, thereby adhering to the code of conduct and ethics as detailed in the Manual
- 12. HEI should not pressurize the Peer Team members for disclosing the contents of the Peer Review Score Sheet (PRSS), and strictly adhere to the confidentiality norms of the process and outcome of the assessment.
- 13. Any violation of the Code of Conduct and Ethics shall be viewed seriously and the HEI will have to face the penal clauses of NAAC and action thereafter by the concerned Statutory Regulatory Authority
- 14. Visit Schedule is attached for your reference.
- 15. At situations of any exigency, decision of NAAC shall be final.
