



FOREWORD

Poised on the threshold of technological growth and all-round initiatives for expansion in the sector of higher education, a dedicated team of the Higher Education Department has brought out this edition of the Annual Report for the year 2010-2011. In view of the fact that we have entered into the modern era of information systems and improved global networking, the process of improvement of quality and access to the higher education system has taken up a significant and substantial step ahead. In spite of the limitations of man-power and resources, conscious measures have been taken to uplift the status of technical education in the State.

During 2010-2011, provisions were made for construction of buildings of West Bengal State University, Barasat. All construction work regarding Guest House Buildings and Girls' Hostel Buildings were complete. Foundation work for the main building, Boys' Hostel Building and Electrical Sub-Station Buildings were also complete. Infrastructural development of Presidency University was taken up in right earnest. The First Vice-Chancellor was appointed. During that year, a substantial fund to the tune of rupees crore were provided for construction of buildings of Gour Banga University, Malda. The structural work of the university building (Administrative and Science Buildings) was complete. Acquisition of land and construction of buildings of "Sidho Kanho Birsa University" in the Districts of Bankura and Purulia were made. The First Vice Chancellor was appointed.

The foundation of the Murshidabad Centre of Aligarh Muslim University had been undertaken. The Government identified 50 acres of land in Mauza Nambutrari in the district of Darjeeling for establishment of the 2nd Campus of Rabindra Bharati University. A land measuring 36.138 acres were taken over by the North Bengal University from Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering College for setting up the 2nd Campus of NBU. For the Vidyasagar University, a fund of Rs. 1.55 crore were released during that year for different construction works. Construction of PG Girls' Hostel under SC special component plan was taken up.

14 General Degree Govt. Aided Colleges had been established in different parts of the state under the Pay Packet Scheme. 33 posts of Principals, 215 posts of Lecturers in different subjects and nearly 260 posts of non-teaching staff were created in these colleges. One General Degree Govt. College viz. A.P.C. Ray Government College was established at Siliguri, District Darjeeling in the 2010-2011 academic session with 1 post of Principal, 20 posts of Lecturers and 5 non-teaching staff. The West Bengal College Service Commission has no official building of their own. Therefore, a fund of Rs. 2 (Two) crore were provided during 2010-2011 for acquisition of land and construction of office buildings.

To meet up with the increasing demand of Technical Education in West Bengal, the State Government took up substantial initiatives over the years. 7 new Engineering and Technology colleges, along with 1 stand-alone MBA college and 3 new MBA Departments were established during

2010-2011. 33 Engineering Colleges introduced new Engineering disciplines along with enhancement of intakes during 2010-2011. This took the total number of Engineering and Technology Colleges in West Bengal including University/University Departments and the Government Engineering and Technology Colleges to 90 with total approved intake capacity of 28751, along with 50 MBA Colleges with 3900 approved intake and 41 MCA Colleges with 2240 approved intakes. Under the Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (TEQIP) Phase-I covering the World Bank Assistance project, State Govt. released full amount of Life Time Allocation of Rs. 147.097 crore for project implementation, and the fund were duly utilized by the eleven programme institutes and the State Project Facilitation Unit. The TEQIP Phase-II project were declared effectively from 6th August, 2010.

The State Govt. scholarship scheme viz. the West Bengal Merit-cum-Means scholarship Scheme is utilized for providing financial assistance to the poor but meritorious students of the State pursuing higher studies at various post Madhyamik level courses. Under Social Education, Calcutta Mathematical Society provides funds for holding both national and international seminars. The Institute of Development Studies Kolkata is devoted to advance academic research in different areas of Social Sciences. The UGC has sponsored the setting up of Rabindranath Tagore Centre of Human Development Studies under the Institute of Development Studies, Kolkata. Construction of its new campus building of Salt Lake is in progress. For the Directorate of State Archives, several improvement schemes have been taken during the year.

I am certain that this comprehensive Annual Report will go to a significant way in generating positive initiatives in the field of higher education through the spirit of informative interaction and co-operation among all the stakeholders and other related departments of the government.

Like in previous years, the Annual Report of 2010-2011 of the Department portrays its significant achievements in the fields of General Education at Under Graduate and Post Graduate level, Technical Education, Doctoral and post Doctoral programmes and Research Activities in different areas of study. The Department's yearly targets in monitoring the various aspects of Professional Education like Engineering & Technology, Management, Teachers' Education including Physical Education and Law have been adequately met, as highlighted in the Report.

Among its various achievements, the State Government has announced the Fee Structure for the Self-Financed Engineering and Technology Colleges and Institutions.

The Central Selection Committee of the West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board had been merged with the main Board to streamline its functioning and to expedite the entire Joint Entrance Examination procedure of the State in the interest of the students.

The Externally Aided and Centrally Sponsored phases of the TEQIP Project are being implmented in the State for improving the quality of technical education and enhancing capacities of the institutes.

Construction of new buildings under the University sector have been taken up during the year, for the West Bengal State University. Infrastructural development of the Presidency University has been taken up in right earnest. As many as fourteen General Degree Govt. Aided Colleges have been established in the State. Seven new Engineering and Technology colleges, along with one stand-alone MBA college and three new MBA Departments have been established during 2010-2011. And thirty three Engineering Colleges have introduced new Engineering disciplines along with enhancement of existing intake during the year.

I appreciate the valuable inputs provided for this publication, by the various departmental sections as well as the Directorates under the aegis of the Department and look forward to helpful feedback and interaction in this respect from all quarters.

A centre for French language studies. There is also a museum at the Institute.

7. INSTITUTE OF ENGLISH :

The Institute was founded by the Government of West Bengal in collaboration with the British Council in 1963. It enjoys full academic autonomy in devising courses and syllabus, conducting examinations and conferring diplomas.

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CHAPTER – 2

ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

2.1 INTRODUCTION

This report is being published for the 19th year in succession. It presents the status of higher education in the state of West Bengal. It describes in particular, the activities of the Department of Higher Education of the Government of West Bengal for the year 2010-2011. It also contains an account of the activities of different organisations and institutions attached to the Department of Higher Education as furnished by the organisations/institutions themselves. However, the report does not provide information on other departments concerned with education. **The report does not have any relevance as a Government Order or official policy pronouncement.**

PRESENT STATUS

The Higher Education Department is the successor to the erstwhile Department of Education. The Department of Mass Education Extension was carved out of the Department of Education to deal with, among other things, the subject of adult education, in terms of Notification No 5106-A.R. dated the 21st April, 1988. The Department of Technical Education & Training was similarly created in terms of Notification No 16129-A.R.dated the 29th June, 1991. The Polytechnic institutions which had so long functioned under the Higher Education wing of the erstwhile Education Department were taken over by the newly created department. Finally, the Education Department was abolished and in its place were created two departments, namely, the School Education Department and the Higher Education Department in terms of Notification No 670-Home (Cons) dated, the 8th Nov, 1995.

2.2 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

The highest executive of the Higher Education Department is the Minister-in-Charge of the Department.

The Principal Secretary is the official head of the Department of Higher Education. He is assisted by Special Secretaries, Joint Secretaries, Deputy Secretaries, Assistant Secretaries and Officers on Special Duty. The Principal Secretary also functions as the Secretary to the Chancellor of the State Universities connected with the Department.



The Department of Higher Education is comprised of a number of branches and cells, namely, Establishment Branch, Budget Branch, University Branch and Chancellor's Secretariat, Non-Govt. College Branch, Govt. College Branch, Appointment Branch, Technical Education Branch, Archives Branch, Miscellaneous and Social Education Branch, Pension Cell, N. S. S. Cell, Vigilance Cell, Audit Cell and Computer Cell.

EDUCATION DIRECTORATE

The commitment of the Department of Higher Education in financial and administrative matters of the Colleges (Govt. and Non-Govt.) is carried out through the Education Directorate. The Directorate is headed by the Director of Public Instruction who is also an ex-officio Secretary to the Govt. of West Bengal.

The D.P.I. is assisted by Addl. Directors of Public Instruction (A.D.P.I), Joint Directors of Public Instruction (J.D.P.Is), Deputy Directors of Public Instruction, Asstt. Director of Public Instruction. The sections of the Education Directorate which deal with various matters related to the Colleges include Appointment, College (Non-Govt. and Govt.), Pay Packet (PPS), U.G.C., Training, Accounts, Physical Education, Scholarships & Stipends, Planning & Statistics (P & S), Social Education, Hindi Education, National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.) and Law. There are also some special cells under the Directorate, namely, Audit Cell, Integrated Law Cell, etc. The sectional activities are performed under the supervision of different JDPIs, DDPIs. Besides, there are Accounts and Administrative Officers who supervise functions like release of pay packet, grants, pension, drawal of salaries etc.

DISTRICT LEVEL ADMINISTRATION

There are three Regional Education Offices under the Education Directorate located in Calcutta, Chinsurah and Jalpaiguri, controlling Presidency, Burdwan and Jalpaiguri divisions respectively. Regional Education Officers (R.E.O.) are in charge of these three offices. They have the status of an Addl. D.P.I. There are also three Duputy Regional Education Officers in the said three divisions. At present, R.E.O. is in charge of Burdwan Division : two D.E.R.O.'s are in charge of Presidency Division. R.E.O. & D.R.E.O.s assist the D.P.I. in the supervision of the No-Govt. Colleges. The D.R.E.O., Jalpaiguri also releases the pay packet for colleges in all the districts of Jalpaiguri division excepting Malda district. R.E.O. and D.R.E.O. in charge of the respective divisions are also in charge of Govt. & Non Govt. College inspection.

DIRECTORATE OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Higher Education Department exercises administrative and financial control over the engineering and technological colleges in this State through the Directorate of Technical Education which is headed by the Director of Technical Education (D.T.E.). The D.T.E. is assisted by an Addl. Director, a Joint Director of Technical Education, Deputy Directors of Technical Education, Assistant Directors of Technical Education and other staff members.



DIRECTORATE OF STATE ARCHIVES

It is a specialised wing of the department of Higher Education functioning as a historical official records.

THE WEST BENGAL STATE COUNCIL OF HIGHER EDUCATION

It was established in 1994 with a view to assisting the Department in formulating policy and implementation of certain matters entrusted to it. The office bearers of Council have also been assigned certain statutory functions under the West Bengal Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institutions Act, 2000.

WEST BENGAL COLLEGE SERVICE COMMISSION

The Commission came into existence in 1979. It prepares merit panels of candidates eligible for recruitment to the posts of Lecturer in different subjects in non-government colleges affiliated to the universities of West Bengal. It also recommends candidates for appointment in the vacant posts of Principal in these colleges. The Commission also organises State level Eligibility Test (SLET) for Lecturership in Universities and Colleges.

WEST BENGAL DISTRICT GAZETTEERS

This wing of the Department publishes or reprints the Gazetteers of different districts of West Bengal, the State Gazetteer and allied literature.

PASCHIM BANGA HINDI ACADEMY

This Academy has been promoting education in Hindi in West Bengal since 1990.

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CHAPTER – 3

MAIN ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR

3.1 INTRODUCTION

Two new universities e.g. Presidency University (erstwhile Presidency College), Sidhu-Kanu-Birsha University have been established during the year. Out of the three Govt. Degree Colleges proposed to be set up, one college at Siliguri has already been established. Substantial progress has been made in respect of other two colleges. The West Bengal State Council of Higher Education, established under West Bengal Act, XXXVII of 1994 has been amended. Accreditation status of the colleges (by NAAC) has been improved substantially. Scope for Post Graduate education has been expanded in General Degree Colleges. The State Govt. has provided fund for the construction, repair and renovation of buildings, setting up of laboratories and new class rooms in the universities and colleges. The Government, as in previous years, approved the setting up of self financing colleges including non-government colleges and B.Ed. Colleges under pay packet scheme and sanctioned the creation of teaching and non-teaching posts for these colleges. Govt. also created 1000 teaching posts (to be updated) in non-government colleges and provided funds for development of infrastructure. The West Bengal State Council of Higher Education took an active role in coordinating activities of the state universities and advised them on various issues relating to improvement in the quality of Higher Education in the State. For Qualitative improvement of technical education. The State Govt. has introduced a system for assessing the colleges. To assist the poor and meritorious students, scope of Merit-cum-Means Scholarship has been expanded.

3.2 POLICIES

The following principles have guided the formulation and implementation of different programmes for higher education.

- (i) Expansion of access to higher education and decentralisation of power-base.
- (ii) Equity in educational opportunity and social justice.

- (iii) Consolidation and qualitative improvement of colleges and expanding the base of social relevance of higher education.
- (iv) Linkage of education to employment through vocationalization.
- (v) Emphasis on engineering and technological education with special reference to Information Technology and Bio-Technology.
- (vi) Diversification of subject compositions.
- (vii) Emphasis on Basic Science courses and scientific research.
- (viii) Emphasis at the same time on Liberal arts, culture, languages, physical education and humanistic values.
- (ix) Mobilisation of internal resources.
- (x) Accountability at all levels.

3.3 BUDGET OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

The total budgetary provision excluding the provision under Central Scheme for the year 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 has been Rs. **1943,75,78,000** and Rs. **1944,29,90,000** out of which the amount provided in the Plan Budget was Rs. **200,00,000** and Rs. **220,00,00,000** respectively.

3.4 POST-GRADUATE COURSES IN DIFFERENT COLLEGES

Post Graduate Courses in some General Degree Colleges (GDC)(Government and Government aided Colleges) have been opened in numbers in the recent years, particularly after 2000 for the purpose of

- I. Expansions of access to higher education to a large number of pass outs numbering more than 67,000 in all Hons. and more than 75,000 students in General courses on an average every year;
- II. Reduction of load of increasing student population on universities ;
- III. Equity in educational opportunity and expanding the base of social relevance of higher education;
- IV. Diversification of subject composition etc.

Year of Introduction :

Most of the PG teaching departments have started functioning after the year 2000, although history of post graduate teaching in Govt. Colleges dates back to the 60's of the last century e.g. Presidency College of Kolkata, Darjeeling Government College of Darjeeling etc. where subjects like Botany, Geology, Zoology etc. were being taught.

Distribution of PG Teaching Colleges :

There are at present 81 PG teaching General Degree Colleges (Government and Government aided Colleges) having at least one in each district of West Bengal (Enclosure- I). This is depicted as follows :

Types of PG teaching Colleges :

The PG teaching GDCs may be classified into three types on the basis of their modes of operation.

- Totally on Self Financing basis for which the students are to pay tuition and other fees at rates varying from college to college and from subject to subject (Vide G.O. No. 785-Edn(CS); dt. 11/07/2001) &/or Universities.
- b) In the UG section of the concerned PG Dept there are teachers (under Pay Packet Scheme) who along with some Guests & Part time faculties are sharing the additional work load of the PG Section. In these cases also the students are to pay fees higher than the prescribed rates.
- c) All Govt. GDCs run PG Courses as per the prescribed fee structure.

A majority of the PG Departments now run in the condition stated at item no. b.

3.5 TECHNICAL EDUCATION

7 (seven) new Engineering College have been set up on self-financing basis in the academic session 2010-2011. Till 2010-2011, total number of degree level Engineering & Technology Colleges is '90' (ninety) and the total intake capacity is '28751'. All these Colleges in the State are AICTE approved and affiliated by WBUT or other State Universities.

The State Government has taken a policy to encourage Private Institutions to introduce core disciplines (Civil, Electrical, Mechanical, etc.). Accordingly many such courses have been introduced. Two new PG courses have been introduced and NBA accreditation of four UG courses have been obtained for Jalpaiguri Engineering College.

In 2010-11 funds have been released for Development of existing playground at Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering College, Construction of new G+3 building at Govt. College of Engg. And Leather Technology, Kolkata and construction of auditorium and Guest House at Govt. College of Engineering and Textile Technology, Serampore.

3.7 NON-GOVERNMENT COLLEGES

The State Government assists the non-government colleges to improve their quality of education and infrastructure.

Funds are sanctioned for development programmes such as repair/construction of classrooms, common rooms, toilets, libraries, laboratories, auditoriums, hostels, and boundary walls as well as repair/installation of electrical works during the financial year 2010-2011.

1. Dev. of Women's College.

The amount of Rs. 47,42,680/- has been provided to Rishim Bankim Chandra College for Women, North-24-Parganas for completion of construction of four storied Building. Fund has been sanctioned for construction of building in favour of Banipur Mahila Mahavidyalaya North-24-Pgns. and Raniganj Girls' College, Burdwan. Financial assistance has been provided to Bankura Zilla Saradamani Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Bankura for construction of Girls' common room for remedial Coaching Centre for SC/ST students.

2. Financial assistance for AILA affected colleges.

The total amount of Rs. 60,11,172/- has been provided for waiving tuition and other fees of the students of AILA affected Colleges i.e. Pathar pratima Mahavidyalaya, North-24Pgns, Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya, North-24-Pgns, Sundarban Mahavidyalaya, North-24-Pgns, Raidighi College, Bhangar Mahavidyalaya, Sagar Mahavidyalaya, & Sukanta College of North-24-Parganas, Dist.

3. Development of non-govt. Colleges.

3.9 MEASURES FOR QUALITY IMPROVEMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION

A) Assessment & Accreditation through National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) :

State Quality Assurance Cell under the aegis of W.B. State Council of Higher Edn has been organizing workshops and sensitization programmes for the colleges for NAAC – accreditation. As per NAAC-stipulation 342 colleges in our State are eligible for "NAAC-Accreditation" - out of these colleges, (till 15/12/2010) 232 Gen. Deg. colleges are accredited by NAAC for the first time. However, in addition to above, 15 Training (B.Ed.) colleges/ institutions, 1- Art college and 2-Technical colleges are also accredited by the NAAC.

As on 15/12/2010, 8- Gen. Deg. Colleges are Re-Accredited by NAAC.

B) Accreditation of Engineering & Technology Courses (NBA of AICTE) :

All the three technology courses in 4 Govt. tech colleges have been accredited by NBA. In addition, four UG courses in Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering Colleges have been accredited. A few courses in six self financing colleges also received MBA accreditation.

3.10 SCHOLARSHIP & STIPEND

In order that no brilliant student is prevented from pursuing post-matric, higher studies because of poverty, the Central Government as well as the State Government introduced various scholarship schemes, five of which are being currently administered in the state by the Scholarship and Stipend Section of the Education Directorate, Government of West Bengal, Bikash Bhavan, 9th floor, North Block, Salt Lake, Kolkata-700 091 :

- National Scholarship Scheme i)
- ii) National Merit Scholarship Scheme
- General Stipends iii) D.P.I. Special Stipend Scheme
- Adhoc Grants (institutional)
- iv) Hindi Scholarship Scheme
- West Bengal Govt. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Scheme v)

I. **National Scholarship Scheme**

Introduced in 1961-62, this scheme ran for more than four decades before being formally withdrawn from the 2004-05 session. This means no candidates passing their gualifying examination (like Madhyamik / H.S / Graduation) in 2004-05 or later can apply for the National Scholarships any more; only the renewal cases are sanctioned now for those students who came into the fold of this scholarship scheme before 2004-05.

II. National Merit Scholarship Scheme

In replacement of the earlier National Scholoarship Scheme, this scheme was introduced with effect from the 2004-05 session, but it continued only for three years before getting withdrawn with effect from the 2007-08 session. Several changes were effected in the funding pattern, rate, quota, selection criteria etc. For this scheme also, no fresh candidate can now apply. The scholarships are being released only for those candidates who came into the fold of this scheme between 2004 and 2006. While the sanction of scholarships for the candidates from 2004-05 and 2005-06 years is progressing smoothly, that for the candidates from 2006-07 year is held up for unavoidable reasons. It is hoped that the problem will be sorted out soon.

III. D.P.I. Special Stipend Scheme:

This covers two types of financial assistance : (i) General Stipend, and (ii) Ad-hoc grant. Funding is entirely from the State Government Exchequer.

D.P.I. Special Stipends (General Stipend) have been traditionally used to be given to those Madhyamikpassed / graduation-passed students who had good results but not enough to get them a place in the merit list for National Scholarship / National Merit Scholarship. A fresh Madhyamik-passed student may continue to get the stipend till the last year of his/her graduation, provided she/he continues to perform above a prescribed level in each of the intervening promotional examinations.

Because the rate per month for this stipend is quite low and because the State Government has introduced a much more attractive scholarship scheme, called the W.B. Govt. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Scheme, w.e.f. the 2006-07 academic year, the D.P.I Special Stipend Scheme is fast loosing its relevance for the students. Either the rate and quota for the scheme have to be revised and rationalised soon, or the scheme may be withdrawn altogether. The decision may be taken shortly.

The other category of D.P.I. Special Stipend, called Ad-hoc Grant, is given to four institutions in the state if they apply in time – (i) R.K. Mission Vidyapith, Purulia, (ii) R.K. Mission Ashrama , Sarisha, (iii) R. K. Mission Multi-purpose school, Kamarpukur and (iv) Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering College, who in turn disburse this grant among their most needy and meritorious students.

In order to encourage the study of Hindi in Non-Hindi speaking states, Government of India has implemented the Hindi Scholarship Scheme for the post-matric students [H.S., U.G., P.G., and Research (M. Phil. / Ph.D. etc)]. The scholarship is given to students whose mother tongue is not Hindi and who are studying in a Non-Hindi speaking state in a recognized full-time course with Hindi as the sole subject or as one of the combination subjects. The total quota of Hindi Scholarships for West Bengal is 239.

V. West Bengal Government Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Scheme (W.B.G. M-C-M. S. S.) :

Thus, the Directorate of School Education (DSE) handles the H.S.-level; the Education Directorate (i.e. the Directorate of Public Instruction, or DPI) handles the UG (Arts, Commerce, Science and non-Engg. & non-Med. Professional Courses)-level as well as the PG (Arts, Commerce, Science and non-Engg. & non-Med. Professional Courses)-level; the Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) handles the UG (Engg.)-level; the Directorate of

MAIN ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR

Technical Education & Training (DTET) handles the UG (Polytechnic)-level and the Directorate of Medical Education (DME) handles the UG (Med.)-level of the scholarship scheme. There is a high-power Steering Committee headed by the Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge of Higher Education, West Bengal, for the over-all supervision and monitoring of the scheme.

There is no system of distributing any prescribed application forms for this scholarship; instead the application format is published in newspaper advertisements inserted by the Government of West Bengal around June-July seeking applications for the scholarship. For applicants in the 2008-09 academic year the minimum eligibility criteria included: (i) Yearly Income of the applicant's family from all sources not exceeding Rs. 80,000/-, and, (ii) 75% marks in aggregate in the Madhyamik or the H.S. Exam. for applying respectively for the H.S.-level or the UG-level scholarships, or 55% marks in the Honours subject in graduation for the PG-level scholarships.

In order to extend relief to the poor and meritorious students admitted into Govt. Engineering and Technology Colleges, the State Govt. has taken measures to grant the benefit of full and half free studentship. 10% students selected on merit cum means basis will come under the purview of the scheme each year. Private self financing colleges have also been brought under such facilities extent of minimum 5%.

Private self financing colleges have also been asked to extend such facilities to the possible extent.



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CHAPTER – 4

ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY AND MANAGEMENT EDUCATION

4.1 INTRODUCTION :

The State of West Bengal has a very rich heritage of education and culture. All the Nobel Laureates of our country have worked in this State. The higher social values for intellectual inputs and creativity prevail in the State. The large manpower of the State, willing to undertake technical education, is one of its great strengths. The government initiative acts synergistically for the rapid growth of technical education. Cheaper cost of study per student as compared to other states is also a positive side. The consciousness of the people too is very conductive for technical education. The quality conscious and judicious consumers of the state in turn place demands for quality technocrats willing to combat the challenges of the new millennium.

With this background, the State of West Bengal is marching forward towards the expansion of Higher Education in engineering & technology and also in management education. More specifically, in the last ten years, the growth rate in Higher Technical Education in West Bengal has remarkably improved, particularly in the emerging areas like information technology, computer science and engineering, electronics and communication engineering, etc. following the need of the hour.

4.2 EXPANSION IN DEGREE LEVEL ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION IN THE STATE :

In 1947-48, there were only 3 (three) Engineering Colleges in West Bengal with an intake capacity of only '320' students. From 1948-1961 the growth of Technical Education in the State was satisfactory as the number of Colleges increased from 3 to 12 and the intake capacity increased from '320' to '1452'. But after 1961 till 1994 i.e. for more than three decades, there were no further expansion of degree level Engineering Education. It was in the 1995 i.e. the later part of 8*th Plan Period (1992-93 to 1996-97) that a new Government Engineering College in the name of Kalyani Engineering College (renamed as Kalyani Government Engineering College at present) was established at Kalyani in Nadia District.*

The 8th Plan Period ended with establishment of another Engineering College under private initiative at Haldia in the name of 'Haldia Institute of Technology'. Till the end of the 8th Plan Period the intake capacity for degree level Engineering & Technology was '1652'.

Eventually, the growth rate of degree level education in Engineering & Technology has been accelerated throughout 9th Plan Period (i.e. from 1997-98 to 2001-02) and 10th Plan Period (i.e. 2002-03 to 2006-07) and the same is still in progress in the 11th Plan Period (i.e.2007-08 to 2011-12). In 2010-11, the total number of degree level Engineering & Technology the Colleges is '90' and the total intake capacity is '28751'. All these Colleges in the State are AICTE approved and affiliated by WBUT or other State Universities.

In the University/University Departments and Government Engineering & Technology Colleges students are admitted only through a Common Entrance Examination (JEM) conducted by West Bengal Joint Entrance Examination's Board. In the Self-financing Engineering & Technology Colleges of this State besides JEM, 10% seats are filled up out of the merit listed candidates of AIEEE conducted by CBSE. Moreover, in those Self-financing Engineering & Technology Colleges 10% seats are filled up through Management Quota.

4.3 EXPANSION IN MANAGEMENT EDUCATION IN THE STATE :

Management is the process of designing and maintaining an environment in which individuals, working together in groups, become efficient to accomplish selected aims & objectives. It is felt that the need of present day's industry is quality leadership to be provided by Managers in different sectors, including industry acceptance from very first day of one's joining a job and that is why personnel with management education are in a great demand.

In our State many management institutions have been established by the Government as well as by private initiative in last few years to cater to the enhanced requirement of managerial personnel. In the early 50's , there were only one management institution namely the Institution of Social Welfare and Business Management, Kolkata and thereafter in early 60's the Indian Institute of Management, Joka was established. But these two Institutions could not fully met the requirement of this category of personnel. As a result, further expansion of management institutions was felt necessary. Accordingly, many State Universities have established Management Departments and further growth occurs due to establishment of MBA Institutions through private initiations. Students are admitted in Management courses through All India Exams. such as CAT, MAT etc. and also through the State Level Entrance Examination JEMAT conducted by West Bengal University of Technology. In 2010-11, the total number of approved institutions conducting MBA courses is '50' and the intake capacity is '3900'.

4.4 EXPANSION IN MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (MCA) EDUCATION IN THE STATE :

Commencement from the early half of 1970's there has been initiative to establish course in the field of Computer Science & Engineering. The ever-growing use of Computer in a wide variety of fields was witnessed during the last few decades. This situation was duly taken into consideration by the Government of India as well as Government of West Bengal by laying stress on Computer Education in the National Policy of Education 1986.

The Higher Education system of the country had spared no efforts to identify the needs of the Computer professionals in different sectors and devised variety of programs including Master of Computer Application (MCA).

In this State, up-to 1994-95 academic session there were only 3 (three) universities i.e. Jadavpur University, Bengal Engineering College (D.U.) and North Bengal University where MCA course was offered with very limited intake capacity (100 Nos.).

Considering the demand and job opportunities many more State Universities and Government as well as Private Institutions have started the MCA course. At present, in the academic session of 2010-2011 the MCA course is conducted in 41 Institutions and the approved intake capacity is '2260'. In this State MCA seats are filled up through a State Entrance Examination JECA conducted by West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board.

4.6 STATE GOVERNMENT FUND SANCTIONED AND RELEASED (Rs. Lakh) :

4.6.1 Development under the Major Plan Head '2203' in 6(six) Government Engineering & Technology Colleges for the year 2010-2011.

The fund under this head has been mainly utilized for different development works of laboratory, library, workshop, etc. purchasing furniture for Office, hostel, Colleges, etc. and for A.M.C. of various equipment. The fund has also been utilized for setting up of the laboratory and purchase of books & journals for introduction of post-graduate courses and also for introduction of under graduate courses.

- Funds have been released for the projects like construction of deep tube-well, pump house, renovation of electrical installation in Electrical Engineering deptt. and in many cases funds have been released partially like extension of hostel building, vertical extension of administrative building, construction of auditorium, construction of central library, etc. which will be taken up also in 2010-2011 as ongoing projects for Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering College, Jalpaiguri.
- 2. In 2009-2010 funds have been released as per the estimates for many projects like horizontal extension of Chhatrinibas, extension work of Pritilata Chhatrinibas, etc. for Kalyani Govt. Engineering College, Kalyani.
- 3. Many works have been done where the funds have been released as per the estimated cost i.e. for construction of new building special repair and revocation of dying machine room of chemistry room, textile lab., for Govt. College of Engineering & Textile Technology, Berhampur.
- 4. Funds have been released for construction of auditorium and guest house partially and also for acquisition of land for girls' hostel as per the estimate cost in the financial year of 2009-2010 for Govt. College of Engineering & Textile Technology, Serampur.
- 5. For Govt. College of Engineering & Ceramic Technology, Kolkata funds have been released for the projects like supply and installation of passenger elevator, civil work for modular lift, installation works for auditorium, bituminous work for compound road etc.
- 6. Funds have been released partially for construction of G+3 building and as per the estimated cost of special repair works of rental hostel building, rewiring of renovated hostel, installation of passenger elevator, installation of silent generator, etc.

4.7 LATERAL ENTRY SCHEME :

Besides 4-Year degree level Engineering & Technology courses in the State of West Bengal, a good number of students is also admitted to different diploma level Polytechnic Institution through a separate Joint Entrance Examination. A good percentage of such students is academically very proficient and their performance in diploma examinations as well as in professional / industrial fields have been found to be very much satisfactory. But unfortunately, there have been no further scope to enrich the technical qualifications of such diploma holders of his State except a very limited scope available through continuation education programme at the faculty of Engineering & Technology, Jadavpur University which is a 5-year part-time evening B.E. course for diploma engineering students.

In pursuance of the scheme of All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the State Government has extended the scope of degree level Engineering Education to the diploma holders through the introduction of 'Lateral Entry Scheme' for admission of the diploma holders in degree Engineering / Pharmacy of the State directly into 2nd Year /3rd semester of 4-Year course from the academic session 2001-2002. Under this scheme, diploma holders from the Polytechnic Institutions with 60% marks in aggregate have got the opportunity for admission after qualifying a State Level Common Entrance Test JELET conducted for this purpose. The intake capacity is upto the extent of 10% of the total approved intake along with the vacant seats of the first year. From the academic session of 2008-09 students with 60% marks in B.Sc. are also made eligible for admission under the Scheme as per provision of the AICTE.

4.8 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO POOR & MERITORIOUS STUDENTS STUDYING IN ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY COLLEGES IN THIS STATE :

4.8.1 West Bengal Government Merit-Cum-Means Scholarship Scheme :

In terms of Notification vide No. 401A-Edn(T) dt. 25.4.2007 a new scholarship scheme known as "West Bengal Government Merit-Cum-Means Scholarship Scheme" has been introduced from the academic session of 2006-07 in the State for the students studying in degree level Government & Government aided Engineering & Technology Colleges in the year 2006. Since the year 2007, this scheme is opened for all degree level Engineering & Technological Institutions including self-financing institutions.

The scholarship amount is Rs.16,800/- per student per year. In the session 2010-11 this Directorate has selected 1086 candidates (fresh 200 and renewal 986) as MCM scholarship holder. For undergraduate level scholarships, candidates must obtain at least 75% marks consisting of two language subjects and three best elective subjects. Students who are enrolled in the first year of Under Graduate Course after passing the H.S Examination or equivalent in the same year will be eligible to apply for this year's Scholarship Scheme.

No student was allowed to receive cheque of MCM Scholarship for 2010-11 if he/she already enjoys any other scholarship / stipend (other than MVM scholarship) either from State or Central Government for the same course of students.

It is also worthwhile to mention in this context that the student who are already enjoying Half/Full Free studentship from the college will have no bar of receiving MCM Scholarship or vice versa.

4.8.2 Financial assistance to poor and meritorious students of Private unaided Engineering Colleges in this State :

With the enhancement of tuition fees, the Fee Structure Committee has also recommended for provision of free studentship to the meritorious and economically backward students allowing full free studentship to at least 10% of the students and half free ship to at least 5% of the students of their approved annual intake against the management quota of 10% of the approved intake sanctioned by the State Government.

The provision has been made in the G.O. vide NO. 450-Edn(T) dt. 26.6.2008. This provision has been implemented by most of the College authorities towards financial assistance to such students who submitted their prayer and are found eligible as per norms.

4.9 SIGNIFICANT POLICIES ADOPTED FOR EFFECTIVE GOVERNANCE OF PRIVATE SELF-FINANCING INSTITUTIONS :

4.9.1. Admission through single window system :

Except the Management Quota (10%), the entire seats (90%) are allotted to the students by the Central Selection Committee (Engineering & Technology) from the merit list of JEM/AIEEE through single window system.

4.9.2 Restructuring of the Governing Body and its proper functioning as per guidelines of AICTE :

Due attention has been given for constitution of the Governing Bodies of the Colleges following AICTE norms. The State Government has taken pro-active role towards their proper functioning. The Colleges conduct the Governing Body meetings at regular intervals with appropriate agenda items where Govt. in the Higher Education Department, Directorate of Technical Education and State Technical University participate as members.

4.9.3 Admission against Management Quota :

The self-financing degree level Engineering & Technology Institutions are filling up 10% of their approved intake directly through Management Quota has approved by the State Government. The Management Quota is to be filled up stream-wise from the merit listed candidates of WBJEE/AIEEE. Registration of students admitted under management quota stream-wise is to be completed first with the WBUT i.e. prior to the registration of other students admitted through the central counseling process.

4.9.4 Fee-structure of various courses in Private Engineering Colleges :

This is controlled by the Fee Structure Committee duly constituted by the State Government. Fees for all the degree level professional institutions are suggested by this Committee.

4.9.5 Rating of Private Institutions for gradual up-gradation :

A methodology has been evolved to assess the overall performance of these institutions. Some quality markers have been identified and information on those aspects are collected from the self-financing colleges on a regular basis. Some grade points are assigned against each such quality marker based on which scoring of each College is done. By this process, significantly weak areas of each College are being identified so that those can be improved over a given time frame.

4.10 SIGNIFICANT POLICIES ADOPTED FOR GOOD GOVERNANCE OF GOVERNEMNT ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY COLLEGES :

4.10.1 Restructuring of the Governing Body :

The Governing Bodies of all 6 (six) degree level Government Engineering & Technology Colleges have been restructured with more powers and functions vested on the Governing Body and with more members from the industry houses. In many of the Governing Bodies the Chairman himself is from the industry so that appropriate suggestions can be given by the members of the Governing Body for the development of such professional Colleges. After the implementation of the Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (TEQIP) all the six (06) Government Engineering & Technology Colleges are enjoying autonomy to some extent and as such the decision of the Governing Body and its functioning is important for smooth and proper running of these Colleges.

4.10.2 Block Grant System and sanction of fund :

From the last quarter of the financial year 2008-2009, the block grant system of sanction of fund has been introduced in all the 6(six) Government Engineering & Technology Colleges. In case of 4 (four) Government Engineering & Technology Colleges under TEQIP i.e. Jalpaiguri Govt. Engineering College, Jalpaigur ; Kalyani Govt. Engineering College, Kalyani; Govt. College of Engineering & Textile Technology, Serampur and Government College of Engineering & Ceramic Technology, Kolkata, block grant system was introduced earlier with the implementation of institutional reforms towards financial autonomy and lastly the same has been extended to two other Government Engineering & Technology Colleges i.e. Govt. College of Engineering &Textile Technology, Berhampur and Govt. College of Engineering & Leather Technology, Kolkata. Under the block grant scheme the non-salary non-plan items as a whole are allotted as a grant-in-aid where the institutions are having their autonomy to utilize the fund as per their requirement and necessity. Under the financial autonomy the institutions can retain and utilize the entire tuition fees collected, IRG generated and retained and operate four funds for specific purpose.

4.10.3 Constitution of Financial Management Committee (FMC) :

The State Government has also constituted the Financial Management Committee in each College for gainful utilization of the block grant scheme and other related matters pertaining to plan and non-plan fund requirements under the overall control of the Governing Body/ Board of Governors of each of these Institutions where accountability and transparencies are maintained beyond the given autonomy.

4.10.4 Financial Assistance to Poor and Meritorious Students :

In the Government College of Engineering & Technology also the system of free studentship and half free studentship is present for the poor but meritorious students. So that good students are not suffered due to financial paucity. State Government has introduced 10% full-free studentship and 10% half-free studentship vide Government Order No. 416-Edn(T) dt. 27th July, 2004. for these Institutions.

4.11 PROHIBITION OF RAGGING AND RTI ACT, 2005 :

The State of West Bengal has formulated the Prohibition of Ragging Act in 2000 and rules thereof in 2001. The Act and Rules for Prohibition of Ragging issued by the State Government have been

circulated to the Institutions to display the same in proper places of the Institutions for information of the students and all other concerned persons. The Committee to look after the ragging cases i.e. Anti Ragging Committee has also been formed in each and every Institution. State Government has also constituted an Appellate Committee in this regard. Necessary measures as per the Prohibition of the Acts and Rules are taken from time to time in case of any incidence of ragging. Measures have also been taken to provide separate hostels for the 1-year students as far as possible in the Government Engineering & Technology Colleges.

Directorate of Technical Education time to time sends guidelines towards prohibition of ragging to all the Institutions under its purview. Honorable Supreme Court's recent guidelines (issued on May, 2009) on prohibition of ragging has also been circulated amongst the Institutes. In terms of this guidelines Instt. Level. University level and District level monitoring are to be done.

This Directorate has already appointed State Public Information Officer & Appellate Authority to deal with the RTI related applications. Moreover all the Govt. Engg. & Technology and Grant-in-Aided Self Financing Engg. & Technology colleges have been instructed to appoint Public Information Officer and Appellate Authority within the jurisdiction of the college.

4.14 PERFORMANCE IN DIFFERENT COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION LIKE GATE, CAT BY THE STUDENTS IN THE VARIOUS ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY COLLEGES IN THE STATE OF WEST BENGAL.

The students of different Government Engineering & Technology Colleges are performing good results in the competitive examination for the Higher Studies like GATE for Post Graduate Studies and CAT for Post Graduate Management Studies. Even the students in some of Private Engineering Colleges have scored very high percentile/GATE score as well as CAT score.

4.15 TECHNICAL EDUCATION QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (TEQIP)

Under World Bank funded Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (Phase-I), the State Govt. released full amount of Life Time Allocation of Rs. 147.097 crore for Project implementation which has been allmost fully utilized by the Programme Institues (11 in number) and State Project Facilitation Unit. TEQIP Phase-I started a reform process in 2004/2005 and ended in March, 2009.

To continue the development activities initiated through TEQIP-I, a sequel of project is planned as TEQIP Phase-II on 25:25 (G.O.I. : State) fund sharing basis. For the financial year 2010-11, Rs. 27.00 crore has been provided as Central share and Rs. 9.00 crore as State Share in relevant Heads of Accounts. Preparatory activities are being conducted by State Project Facilitation Unit (SPFU).

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CHAPTER – 5

UNIVERSITIES

5.1 GENERAL INFORMATION :

A bill for upgradation of Presidency College to the status of University has duly been passed. This would enable this premier institution of education of our country to function more efficiently as a teaching.training and research centre in various branches of knowledge.

Presidency University has been set up by virtue of Presidency University Act, 2010 under notification No. 1047-L dated 07-07-2010. 27th July, 2010. Thereafter, vide this Department notification No. 694-Edn(U) dated 14/12/2010 the Governor was pleased to appoint 16th December 2010 as the day with effect from which, and until the appointed day all the functions and powers of the University, the Court, the Executive Council, the Faculty Councils for Post-graduate and Undergraduate Studies, the Boards of Studies, the Finance committee and all other authorities to be constituted under this Act or the Statute.

The matter of setting up of a centre of A.M.U. in Murshidabad district is under active consideration of the Govt. Recently some positive response has been received from the concerned university. The Govt. of West Bengal has identified the required lands for the purpose and sent the particulars of the land to the A.M.U. The team of 5 officials including Vide-Chancellor of the University have recently visited the site. The matter of transfer of 259.74 acres of land is now in process. Recently a building has been taken temporarily to launch the M.B.A. and Law course.

The Govt. of West Bengal in the Department of Higher Education has taken a decision to establish one university named Sidho-Kanho-Birsa University in the districts of Bankura and Purulia.

5.1.3 ACADEMIC STRUCTURE

Academic activities of the universities are carried out through various departments under different Faculty Councils. The Deans of these Councils advise on academic matters and co-ordinate the departmental programmes. For the planning and implementation of the academic programmes of the departments, there is a departmental committee in each of them. The Head of the Department is the Chairman of the said committee. The Board of Studies under each Faculty Council plans and reviews the syllabus and assists the examination process.

5.2 CALCUTTA UNIVERSITY (1857)

The Calcutta University along with the Bombay University and the Madras University was established in 1857. The university is now being governed by the Calcutta University Act, 1979 which came into force on February 10, 1983.

The Calcutta University affiliates colleges mostly at the under-graduate level and also offers courses directly at the post-graduate level. The number of colleges affiliated by the University is 171. The university has allowed a few of its affiliated colleges including the Presidency University (earstwhile Presidency College), the Maulana Azad College and the Dinabandhu Andrews College to teach at the post-graduate level.

5.3 JADAVPUR UNIVERSITY (1955)

The intense nationalist movement during 1905-06 to unsettle the settled fact of the partition of Bengal by the British found expression in many forms, of which the establishment of a new system of education on national lines was the most important cultural expression. It was in this way that the National Council of Education (NCE), Bengal was started in 1906 "to impart education–literacy, scientific as well as technical and professional – on national lines and exclusively under national control to incorporate with the best Oriental ideals of life and thought, the best assimilable ideals of the West, and inspire students with the genuine love for and desire to serve the country".

The National Council devoted almost the whole of its resources to technical education through its 'College of Engineering and Technology' to satisfy public demand. By the middle of the 1940's, the College of Engineering and Technology, Bengal was virtually functioning as a University. After Independence the Government of West Bengal, with the concurrence of the Government of India, enacted the necessary legislation to establish Jadavpur University on the **24th December**, **1955**.

Appreciating the overall development in the Engineering & Technology education and research the university received support from World Bank under its TEQIP Programme. Under this programme the university initiated activities in Mobile Computing and related areas in consonance with the contemporary needs including Disaster Management, Cognitive & Social Sciences and Nano Science & Technology.

The University stands on an area of about 60 acres in the southern part of the Calcutta Metropolis about 3 km away from underground Metro Railway Station of Tollygunge. It also has a second campus covering about 20 acres of land in Salt Lake.

The University has 3 Faculties – Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Science and Faculty of Arts. In addition, a number of Schools and Centres have been set up to initiate interdisciplinary post-graduate, doctoral and post doctoral level research programmes in emerging areas. University Grants Commission has accorded Jadavpur University the Status of University with potential for Excellence. NAAC has accredited Jadavpur University as 5 Star University in 2001 and Grade A with (CGPA 3.61) in 2008.

5.4.5 Highlights of the activities during 2010-2011

2nd Campus of Rabindra Bharati University :

The matter of establishment of a second campus of Rabindra Bharati University in the district of Jalpaiguri is under active consideration of the State Govt. The authorities of the university has identified the lands in consultation with the district authority and has approached this Department for issue of 'no objection' in the matter and sanction of fund for land acquisition etc. The Higher Education Department vide its No.606 dated 29.10.09 has approached the L&LR Department. Govt. of West Bengal to transfer 50 acres of the proposed land to this department for the purpose. A proposal for long term settlement of 50 acres of land in favour of Rabindra Bharati University (2nd Campus) of 'Mongpu' of North Bengal University is going to be settled up. The Deputy Regional Education Officer is being communicated in this regard.

5.5 UNIVERSITY OF BURDWAN (1960)

The University of Burdwan is one of the premier institutes of higher learning in eastern region of India and rendering services to cater the needs of the students. It was established under West Bengal Act XXIX of 1959 on 15th June, 1960 as a teaching and affiliating University with six P.G. Departments & Thirty undergraduate colleges spread over five districts of Burdwan, Hooghly (except Srirampur sub-division), Birbhum, Bankura and Purulia. Continuous efforts are being taken to incorporate the latest developments in different disciplines in the present global scenario.

The academic complex is located at a picturesque and sprawling & beautiful campus called Golapbag (The Garden of Roses) - about a mile distance from the Administrative complex of Rajbati, Uttar Phatak, Burdwan. This complexes are within 100 kilometres from Kolkata and are well connected by Railways (Burdwan Junction) and Durgapur Express Highway. Metro Complex of the University is at Bidhannagar, Salt Lake City, Kolkata.

- 9) Due to shortage of ground water, an overhead tank has to be set up for redressal of water scarcity in administrative campus.

5.6 KALYANI UNIVERSITY (1960)

The University of Kalyani was established in 1960 with a campus area of over 400 acres in Kalyani town. It is well connected by road and railway, with a railway station for the University. The University is situated in a locality with rural and backward areas. Yet, its distance from Kolkata is only 60 km. This location advantage of the University makes it particularly suitable for the Cafeteria Approach' of higher education. The University ensures on one hand, the development of excellence, and on the other, contribution of higher education through dissemination of knowledge to rural areas in an open and flexible system. The University is also considering the possibility of upgrading some of its affiliated colleges with the Academic Autonomy, and postgraduate teaching. The University is presently offering **twenty-seven** postgraduate programmes under four faculties, namely, Science, Arts & Commerce, Education, Technology & Management. The total number of approved teaching posts at present is 189, catering to around 2626 postgraduate students. In its administrative set up, there are approximately 32 officers and 517 Staff on the pay-roll at the moment, which vindicates a streamlined academic administration as per the usual norms of teacher-student ratio and teacher-staff ratio. The University is providing academic guidance and leadership to **37(thirty seven)** affiliated degree colleges located in the districts of Nadia and Murshidabad.

5.6.4 Activities of NSS during the year

During the year the university has achieved significant progress in National Service Scheme (NSS) as an integral part of its total activities. It is our target to enroll 6000 student volunteers in 60 units in the university and the affiliated degree colleges.

The most significant achievement is that on behalf of the university 2 NSS volunteers have participated in Republic Day Parade at New Delhi on 26th January 2011. One Programme Officer of our university has participated in NSS Training programme under Youth Develop Programme organized by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, Sriperumbudu, Tamil Nadu).

5.6.5 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE ACTIVITIES DURING 2010-2011

Center for Ecological Engineering.

An International Centre for Ecological engineering is being reorganized by Kalyani University and two posts of lecturers have been sanctioned to revitalize the existing center. The centre has been upgraded to a full fledged teaching Department. A sum of Rs. 64,00,000/- has been sought for by Kalyani University for purchasing laboratory equipments which is now under process.

5.7 UNIVERSITY OF NORTH BENGAL (1962)

The University of North Bengal was established in November, 1962 by Act of the West Bengal Legislative Assembly. In the same year it was accorded recognition of the UGC under Sec. 12(B) and 2(f). It is a state-aided university. The university Act of 1962 was amended in 1978 and THE NEW Act came into force during 1981 and has been operative at present with suitable amendments as and when required.

The University started functioning with 16 affiliated colleges and 6 P.G. Depts. On 1st Nov. 1962 which date is commemorated as its foundation day.

The University has a checkered history. It has grown in a relatively backward region amidst great odds. Even the campus had to be vacated to the army in late 1962 during war with China. It was shifted to Siliguri College and came back to Raja Rammohanpur in 1964. The first convocation was held in 1965 under Chancellorship of Late Smt. Padmaja Naidu, Governor of West Bengal. Prof. B.N.Dasgupta was the first Vice-Chancellor. The present Vice-Chancellor is Prof. Arunabha Basumajumdar holding the office w.e.f, 1st January, 2008.

5.7.5 Distance Education

The Directorate of Distance Education, established in 2000 in University of North Bengal has been conducting Distance Education courses in various subjects at P.O. and U.G. levels including the bridge course. Distance Education courses at P.O. & U.G. Level in seven subjects namely Bengali, English, Nepali, Political Science, History, Philosophy & Mathematics. The Distance Education Council(DEC) New-Delhi, have visited the Directorate of Distance Education of North Bengal University and expressed their satisfaction on the Academic achievements of the Directors. As a result Directorate of Distance Education received recognition from DEC and a fund of Rs. 20,000,00 received from DEC. Total enrollment during the year 9.000(approx). The university has institute OFF Campus mode of Education too.

5.7.6 Highlights of the activities during 2010-2011

2nd Campus of North Bengal University :-

The V.C. of North Bengal University vide his No.3302 dated 26.10.09 has approached this Department for establishment of the above campus building in 36.138 acres of lands inside the campus area of the Jalpaiguri Govt. Eng. College. The Higher Education Department Vide its No.623 dated 10.11.09 has requested the Principal of college to transfer the possession of land to the University. The Govt. has also asked the University to send early the DPR, plan and Estimates duly vetted by the appropriate authority for taking further necessary action. The University has recently taken over the physical possession of 36.138 acres of the proposed land from the JGEC. The matter of actual transfer of title deed in favour of the university is in process. Rough cost estimate and DPR are being processed to send to SPB. Registration of land is yet to be done.

5.8 VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY (1981)

Vidyasagar University, named after one of the most illustrious sons of Bengal as well as one of the doyens of Indian Renaissance, Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, has grown out of a long cultural and educational movement in West Bengal in general and in the undivided district of Midnapore in particular. The idea of founding a University in the district was mooted by various organisations, notably by the Regional Education Association, Midnapore, headed by Professor A.K. Gayen of IIT, Kharagpur. The Ghani Committee appointed by the IUGC also suggested, among others, for the setting up of a University in Midnapore on the ground of its ' having a compact area and a manageable number of colleges' (at that time; here were 36 colleges with an enrolment of about 42,000), and also of its 'having the great advantage of co-operation of the IIT, Kharagpur'. The Committee was also of the opinion hat the new University would 'develop on the lines suited to the needs of this backward area'.To give honour and respect to these pious intentions and proposals, the Government of West Bengal decided in 1976 to establish Vidyasagar University.

5.8.1 THE UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE :

(a) At present the affiliated colleges and institutions of the University are 74 in numbers. Of these, the number of government colleges are 02; those of Girls' Colleges, Professional Colleges (B.Ed.), Law Colleges, Paramedical Colleges and others (PG courses in the UG colleges) are 03,14, 03, 04 and 08 respectively.

The University is located in the Tantigaria mouza under Paschim Medinipur Sadar town. It is 119 k.m. by rail from Howrah Station and 14 k.m. by road from Kharagpur railway station. The University campus is very close to Medinipur railway station (just 1 k.m. from it) and is connected with all the subdivisions under both Purba and Paschim Medinipur districts. The total area of the University is 138.78 acres. The University campus is divided into two : Main (103.74 acres) and Residential (35.04 acres).

5.8.2 Schools and Centres of University with a brief note on the activities of such schools / centres :

Computer Centre

The Centre was established in 1999. Its activities include Program Development, Training Programmes for College and University teachers, employees Research Scholars and Students, and providing computing facilities for other Departments of the University. The Centre has been upgraded with sophisticated computers and accessories under UGC Upgradation scheme in X Plan with the grants received for the purpose. 2 New Lab established. It is functioning with huge crisis of space and manpower.

Gandhian Studies Centre

The Centre, the first of its kind in West Bengal, has been sanctioned by the UGC under its Ninth Plan Programme, for a period of five years at the first instance. It has started its functioning from June 1999. It is located in the Department of Political Science with Rural Administration though it draws on the intellectual resources of other Departments as well, particularly Departments of History, and Philosophy and Life World. There is an Advisory Committee headed by the Vice-Chancellor to guide the activities of the Centre.

For the dissemination of the ideas of Mahatma Gandhi, the Centre, as per the UGC guidelines, organizes seminars, workshops, lecture series on various aspects of Gandhian thought including other relevant contemporary issues seen from the Gandhian perspective, conducts a Six-months' Certificate course on Gandhian Thought, publishes the proceedings of the seminars, workshops as well as lectures delivered periodically, conducts researches/ studies on Gandhian thought and movements, and other related themes, and holds Summer/Winter Camps on Gandhian thought for the postgraduate and undergraduate students.

Women's Studies Centre

The centre has been established at the University in the year 2010. The centre is trying to adopt an interdisciplinary approach by bringing together the different perspectives of various disciplines and departments of the university like, history, literature, cultural studies, philosophy, politics, anthropology, sociology in one hand as well as science and technology on the other. Integration of humanities and social sciences with faculties of physical and life sciences produces uniqueness in all spheres of teaching and training. The centre will also link issues in the study of science and technology with those of gender, culture, and society. The Centre conducted a 2-days Workshop at the University during 30-31 March, 2010.

5.9.2 Highlights of the Activities during 2010-2011

A proposal for approval of the Plan and estimates for construction of buildings of West Bengal State University of project value of Rs.65.01 Crores, has recently been approved by the State Planning Board. In the financial year 2010-2011 a sum of Rs. 15.00 crore was allocated in favour of West Bengal State University, Barasat, out of which Rs. 10.00 crore has been released towards the construction of university building. First statutes of the University has been drafted. Initiative has been taken to open P.F. Account.

5.10 GOUR BANGA UNIVERSITY

The University of Gour Banga has been established by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly vide West Bengal Act XXVI of 2007.

The Appointed Date as per Kolkata Gazette dated 14th March, 2007 is March 10, 2008. From this date all Sections of the Act except Section 1 and Section 57 have come into force.

The University Council as per Section 58(2) has come into effect from May 26, 2008 vide Kolkata Gazette dated 28th May, 2008.

All the general degree colleges, law colleges and teachers training colleges in the district of Malda, Uttar Dinajpur and Dakshin Dinajpur have been brought under affiliation of the University of Gour Banga. Currently there are 37 affiliated colleges out of which 24 general degree colleges provide B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A./B.B.A. / B.H.M. courses/12 colleges provide B.Ed. course/one college offers B. P. Ed. course and one college conducts 5 yrs. Integrated LL.B. (B.A. & LL.B.) course. M.A. courses in English/History are started by Malda College and M.A. courses in Bengali/History/Sanskrit are available in Balurghat College.The University Campus offers M.A. in English/Bengali/Arabic/Sanskrit/History/Education and M.Sc. in Mathematics from December 15, 2008 (2008-09 session).

The University of Gour Banga is approved by the UGC under Section 2(F) of the UGC Act, 1956.

At present the University is fully funded by the Govt. of West Bengal.

Our Vision

Highlights of the Activities during 2010-2011

The State Planning Board has recently accorded its approval for Rs.183.00 Crores for 1st phase construction works of University Building of Gour Banga University, Malda. In the financial year 2010-2011 a sum of Rs. 20,00,00,000/- was allocated in favour of Gour Banga University, Malda , out of which Rs. 3,34,65,754/- has been released towards the construction of university building.

5.11 SIDHO-KANHO-BIRSHA UNIVERSITY (2010)

Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University has been established by virtue of West Bengal Act. XII of 2010 in the districts of Purulia and Bankura. First Vice-Chancellor has been appointed in terms of Notification 590-Edu(U) dt. 5.10.2010. University Council has been constituted. Rs. 50 Lakh has been sanctioned for construction of boundary wall around the proposal land. Stamp duty has been exempted for transferring the land to SKBU. Possession of land measuring12.84 acres has been made over from J. K. College, Purulia. Three non-teaching posts has been sanctioned on contractual basis. Statutes Committee has been framed in SKBU. Notification issued for the colleges of Purulia District to be affiliated to SKBU.

Our Vision :

- a) Encouraging and providing for instruction, teaching, training and research in various branches of learning and courses of study.
- b) Promoting advancement and dissemination of knowledge and learning in Humanities, Science, Commerce and Engineering.
- c) Extending higher education to meet the growing needs of the society.
- d) Propagating the study of indigenous languages as well as culture.
- e) Fostering local art and craft with a move to elicit due recognition in national and international scenario.

1. Academic Scenario :

- i) Introduction of P.G. course in few Arts subjects viz Bangla, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Political Science and Economics.
- ii) M.Phil and Ph.D will be introduced from the current academic session following UGC norms.
- iii) The University needs at least one Associate Professor and two Assistant Professors in the following subject:- a) Political Science b) Sanskrit, c) History.

2. Digitized Library :

i) The University craves for fund from the State Government to modernize library infrastructure, which is, in fact the nerve centre of an University.

3. Research activities :

- i) An exclusive Research wing for "Tribal Studies" will be introduced.
- ii) Research on a) Tribal Medicine and its efficacy in contemporary context b) Tribal Art etc will be encouraged.
- iii) "Life and Contribution of Pandit Raghunath Murmu to Santali Language and Culture" will be highlighted.
- iv) Recognition and propagation of Alchiki script as the sole medium of Santali Language.
- v) The University Council has already proposed creation of three posts of Chair Professor in the names of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha-three pioneers of tribal movement against the British imperialism.

4. Publication :

To commemorate 150th year of Tagores' birth anniversary, the University proposes the following schemes, already approved by University Council.

- i) Translation of selected Tagore works into Santali Language.
- ii) Commemorative volume on Tagore which will highlight Tagore's thought and idea about

 a) the marginalized;
 b) about village reconstruction and such other topics which are
 relevant in contemporary context. Scholars from all over India will be invited to send
 their learned articles on the topics.
- iii) Ten monographs on Tagore's ideas and perception about 'Education', 'Women Empowerment', 'Environmental Awareness' etc. may be published.

5. Vocational Courses :

It has already been resolved that two Certificate Courses will be introduced from the ensuing academic session.

- i) Entry level training for secretarial jobs.
- ii) Communicative English with Personality Development.

6. Seminars :

To elicit students' participation inter-University elocution and inter College, drama and music competition for students may be taken up.

7. Sports and Games :

Both indoor and outdoor games facility have to be provided to students.

8. Propagation of tribal folk culture and art :

The emerged University proposes to play a pivotal role in propagating tribal culture by organizing seminars, symposiums and dance festivals in both national and international scenario as well as chalking out proper marketing avenue for production and sale of coloured masks-an inherent of tribal culture of Purulia.

9. Developing University – industry linkage for bolstering local indigenous craft like "Tassur Silk" and "Lac".

The University is expected to come forward by organizing marketing centres in and outside Purulia for promotion of indigenous industry.

5.12 PRESIDENCY UNIVERSITY (2010)

Presidency University has been set up by virtue of Presidency University Act, 2010 under notification No. 1047-L dated 07-07-2010. 27th July, 2010 was appointed as a date on which sections 2, 6 and 56 of the said Act have come into force; sections 54 and 57 of the said Act came into force from 8th December 2010. Thereafter, vide this Department notification No. 694-Edn(U) dated 14/12/2010 the Governor was pleased to appoint 16th December 2010 as the day with effect from which, and until the appointed day all the functions and powers of the University, the Court, the Executive Council, the Faculty Councils for Post-graduate and Undergraduate Studies, the Boards of Studies, the Finance committee and all other authorities to be constituted under this Act or the Statute, or the Ordinances, shall respectively, be exercised by the Presidency University council.

Presidency University Council has been constituted. 15 members have been nominated by the State Government in the Council in with consultation Chancellor of the university under section 56(2). The drafts of the First Statutes and First Ordinances as prepared by the Committee have been sent to the Law Department of this Government for necessary vetting.

Head of accounts for non-plan salary grants and other grants under State Plan have been opened on 18-01-2011; a sum of Rs. 4.00 crore was sanctioned and released in the financial year to the University as development grant.

Teaching and non-teaching employees of erstwhile Presidency College are governed by West Bengal Service Rules and other rules applicable to Govt. Employees. In terms of section 55(8) (b) of the

Act, the employees of the erstwhile Presidency College have been transferred to the Presidency University with full service benefit as were available to them as Govt. employees prior to such transfer till final absorption under the University. Option forms for such teaching and non-teaching employees of the erstwhile Presidency College and for those who are liable to be posted have been prepared for circulation.

The erstwhile Presidency College had 238 sanctioned posts and all these posts stand transferred to University. Proposal for creation of additional 102 teaching posts is being sent to Finance Department for concurrence. Post of the dean of students has already been created. A proposal for creation of 7 non-teaching posts as received from the University has been sent to Finance Department for concurrence. For post graduate teaching existing space is totally inadequate.

Eden Hindu Hostel which was initially constructed out of the grant of the Maharaja of Mahishaadal for the students of Presidency College coming from outside Calcutta will celebrate its 125 years in 2011. But unfortunately it is in a dilapidated state with an accumulated debt to the tune of Rs. 2.00 lakhs approximately. Immediate repair and renovation of the hostel buildings are to be taken up keeping in mind the 125th anniversary celebration of the hostel.

University had asked for a piece of land for the Second Campus and has been allotted a piece of land measuring 5-acre.

A B+G+9 building plan in the College Street Campus is being prepared by Machintosh Burn Limited. Fund for this building can be partially obtained to the tune of Rupees 5-crore from UGC as a non-12 B institute provided the State Government gives an undertaking for a matching grant upto 100%. However, at least 2-3 years will be needed to occupy this premise and meanwhile University shall have to make arrangement for holding classes etc.

As the existing infrastructure and resources of the University, inherited from the erstwhile Presidency College are not adequate, University could not increase the student strength this year. For building adequate modern technology aided infrastructure and equipment, laboratory facilities for science teaching to a larger number of students, and expanding library facilities (including subscribing to e-journals) for research purpose and completion of computerization of the entire library system, University shall have to procure funds from different funding agencies.

Following the pattern of excellent Universities all over the world and also the stipulations of the UGC, Presidency University is going to introduce a) Semester system b) choice based credit system c) internal evaluation system and d) grading system. The syllabi for UG and PG courses have been framed after conducting workshops under the guidance of leading subject experts.

5.13 NETAJI SUBHAS OPEN UNIVERSITY (1997)

Netaji Subhas Open University was established as a State Open University in 1997 by an Act of West Bengal State Legislature (West Bengal Act XIX of 1997). Netaji Subhas Open University has emerged as a major leader of Open and Distance Education in India through its recognition by the Distance Education Council (DEC) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) since its inception. NSOU, though a State Open University, has drawn national as well as international visibility due to its phenomenal growth. The University has clocked, till date more than 2 lakh learners. Currently the University offers a prodigious variety of courses and programmes at its 173 Study centres spread all over the State.

To spread higher education in different parts of the State and to provide access to higher education and different skill enhancing educational programmes Netaji Subhas Open University

- Provides quality education in a flexible mode to serve the aim of establishing an equitable knowledge society within the state, facilitates higher education through distance learning mode in the language of the State, i.e. Bengali
- Makes education affordable to the disadvantaged
- Provides facility for lifelong education to intending learners
- Strives for upgrading technology without compromising the basic values of the society
- Contributes to the development of the State and the nation and motivates learners to work towards secular, scientific and democratic education

Netaji Subhas Open University has recorded an amazingly phenomenal annual growth in the enrolment of students from all cross-sections of society aspiring for access to higher education. At the end of the academic session 2009-2010 a total of **2,00,172** students are enrolled at **173** study centres in its **16 programmes** and **81 courses** across the State of West Bengal.

II. Schools and Centres of University with a brief note on the activities of such schools/ centres.

Netaji Subhas Open University has the following three (3) academic schools -

- i. School of Science
- ii. School of Humanities and Social Sciences
- iii. School of Non-Conventional Courses

i. School of Science

The School of Science is a very active and dynamic organ of the University. The School runs three (3) M.Sc. courses in Mathematics, Zoology and Geography and six (6) courses at the undergraduate level [i.e. BDP level (Bachelor Degree Programme)] in Zoology, Botany, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Geography. The Study Centres for counseling of Science students at UG and PG level are widely distributed all over the State of West Bengal.

Development during the current year —

There is a steady growth of the School in terms of number of students enrolled and quality of teaching.

Counseling at Alipore Central Corrcetional Home—Faculties from School of Science regularly counsel students of this University who are inmates of Alipore Central Correctional Home as they have no opportunity to attend classes in study centres located outside the correctional home.

Practical Classes on Remote Sensing and Geographic Information System—In the School of Science premises located at Salt Lake a state of the art Remote Sensing and GIS Laboratory has been established to facilitate PG students' practical curriculum. *Geometica 10.1*, a high-end Remote Sensing and GIS Software with 10 licenses has been installed in this computer laboratory. Post Graduate Students of Geography belonging to different study centres are being trained in this laboratory. During current academic session about 95 students got the opportunity of hands on training from this laboratory.

ii. School of Humanities and Social Sciences

The School of Humanities and Social Sciences is the largest academic School of the University both in terms of number of courses and enrolment of students. The School offers Bachelor Degree Programmes (BDP) in Bengali, English, History, Sociology, Economics, Political Science, Public

Administration and Commerce and Post Graduate Degree Programmes in Bengali, English, English Language Teaching, Public Administration, Political Science, Education, Social Work, Commerce and Business Administration, Library and Information Science and also some other PG Diploma, Certificate and Short-term courses like Journalism & Mass Communication, Human Rights, English for Communication, Public Relations and Advertising. The School also has two (2) Second Degree Programmes, *viz.* Bachelor of Library and Information Science and B. Ed. (Special Education).

The *Centre for Language Studies*, the only centre of this University, works under this School and conducts certificate course in English for Communication and Post Graduate Diploma in English Language Teaching (PGDELT).

Academic Activities

Seminars/Symposia/Endowment Lectures—The School organized the following Endowment/ Memorial Lectures :

Special Education programme for physically and mentally challenged—The School offers B. Ed. (SEDE) course in three (3) areas of disability—mental retardation, visual impairment & hearing impairment since 2005.

iii. School of Non-Conventional Courses

In its ceaseless venture to reach the unreached Netai Subhas Open University also imparts knowledge in the area of vocational and non-conventional studies. This is an area where open and distance learning methods can be used extensively to provide need-based, vocation-centric education to build skilled workforce for the society. The University is providing vocational and non-conventional courses so that the learners can engage themselves in income-generating livelihood. Netaji Subhas Open University is providing the opportunity to the existing workforce to upgrade their skill by offering seamless vocational education training through its **84 vocational study centres** all over the State of West Bengal. Presently, there are **5000 learners** on roll in **37 courses** under this department. At present the University exploring the possibility of opening vocational centres at remote areas of the State. The University is also stressing upon the importance of **women empowerment** by imparting different courses exclusively for girls/women. The women empowerment programme "**Amra Pari**" of the University includes community health, infant care and ways to combat malnutrition and special needs of adolescent girls.

iv. Highlights of the important activities and achievements during the year including information on research, publications, patent earned, Ph. D. awarded, collaboration with foreign universities, etc.

a. Recent Developments

- **Construction of a building** with latest facilities on 15 cottah land at Salt Lake, Kolkata. A major part of this building would be available for use in the current academic year.
- **Construction** of further buildings in the Kalyani campus of the University at Nadia district.
- Around 7000 sq. ft. of built up area in a building in Salt Lake has been offered for temporary use of the University by the Government of West Bengal.
- Steps have been taken by the University to take advantage of Satellite Based Education facility as it has been allowed to use a regional beam of EDUSAT. University's own Audio-Visual Studio (Teaching End) has been established to transmit educational programmes in audio-visual format to a number of study centres (Learning End) located at remote districts of West Bengal.
- Online publication of results of BDP and PG Courses from 2009.
- Review system for BLIS, BDP and PG results has been introduced.
- Introduction of Videoconferencing system as part of e-governance initiative.
- Setting up of a Students' Grievance Redressal Cell.
- Introduction of integrated software to process Student Registration, Examination, Grants, Inventory and Accounts using leased line.
- Recruitment of one Professor of Political Science and one IT Officer against substantive positions. Other positions sanctioned by the Government have also been advertised and are in the process of being filled up.
- Establishment of Quality Assurance Cell.
- Setting up of IT Cell.
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5.14 THE WEST BENGAL UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY (2000)

The West Bengal University of Technology (WBUT) has entered in the eighth year of its functioning since it came into operation formally with the assumption of office of the first Vice-Chancellor in the month of January 15, 2001 as a sequel to the promulgation of THE WEST BENGAL UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY ACT, 2000, under the West Bengal Act XV of 2000 passed by the West Bengal Legislature.

This University has 3 (three) Schools :

- 1) School of Engineering & Technology;
- 2) School of Biotechnology & Biological Sciences;
- 3) School of Management & Sciences

1) School of Engineering & Technology :

The School of Engineering & Technology consists of the Departments of Computer Science & Engineering (CSE), Information Technology (IT) and Industrial Engineering & Management (IBM).

The **Department of Computer Science & Engg**, under the School of E.T. offers *B.Tecli. in Computer Science & Engineering (CSE), M.E. in Computer Science and Engineering, M.Tech. in Software Engineering and M.Tech in Microelectronics & VLSI Designs. All the courses are approved by AICTE.* The PG courses are geared towards imparting higher level of qualification to existing and aspiring teachers of technological institutes, inspiring the spirit of research & development and providing skill upgradation for industries.

The University has a computational laboratory, initially developed by *IBM* as a potential *Centre of Excellence*, However, the demand for more space and varied laboratories are felt. *WBU7 actively supports the use of open source*. There is a very well developed *Microelectronic Characterisation laboratory* where PG students are learning skills of electrical characterisation. Two ex-students have joined as *Ph.D. scholars in VLSI designs in IIT Kharagpur and UT-Delhi. One other PG student has joined IIT~Mumbai as project scholar* in Microelectronics & Material research related laboratory. The Fabrication laboratory is being developed. Faculty members have managed to draw fund from Central Government funding agencies to develop the laboratories.

However, the Department **needs more faculty** to support the *courses which are being* successfully run inspite of the adversities. There is a *demand for starting a Department oj Electronics* where B.Tech. & M.Tech. in Electronics & Communication engineering can be offered along with the already existing course of Microelectronics & VLSI Designs, presently run by the Department of CSE.

The **Department of Industrial Engineering & Management** under the School of Engineering & Technology offers M.Tech in Industrial Engineering & Management. This course is AICTE approved.

There is a proposal for opening up B.Tech courses in Electronics and Communication and Computer Science & Engineering in addition to the present B.Tech. courses in the near future

SchooL of Biotechnology & Biological Science

The **Department of Biotechnology** was established in 2003 with a view to develop a center of excellence for education and research in biotechnology. In so doing, a four-semester AICTE-approved and DBT supported M.Tech. programme in Biotechnology was started with students qualifying in the All India level Combined Biotechnology Entrance Examination (CBFE) conducted by **Jawaharlal** Nehru University, New Delhi. It is pertinent to mention that WBUT and Annamalai University are the only two centers in the country in M.Tech Biotechnology supported by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India.

School of Management Sciences

The School of Management Science (SOWS) was set up by the West Bengal University of Technology (WBUT) in July 2006. The aim of the School was to function as a centre for advanced studies and research in Management and allied disciplines. The objectives of the School of Management can be broadly summarized as under :

- 1. Promote cutting edge research in different areas of management, economics and finance, and other social sciences with special emphasis on interdisciplinary research:
- 2. Introduce new and relevant programmes at the postgraduate levels which would foster an effective interface between industry and academics;
- Support the different programmes running under WBUT in management and allied disciplines in terms of updating their course structure and syllabi, and also improve and upgrade the evaluation and examination process.

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To fulfill these objectives, the School of Management started the M. Phil and Ph. D programmes in Management, is actively involved in executive and faculty development programmes, and regularly organizes seminars and workshops.

The **Department of Natural Science** is also currently housed under SOMS and is headed by the Director, School of Management.

Current Activities of the Management School

The activities undertaken by the School of Management to fulfill the afore-mentioned objectives can be grouped under two broad headings :

- 1. In-house activities which seek to promote research, train prospective researchers and introduce high-quality academic programmes;
- 2. Supervisory activities which try to support undergraduate and post-graduate programmes in the affiliated colleges of the University. **In-house Activities**

(A) Programmes offered in Management

M. Phil and Ph. I in Management - WBUT has given approval to several institutes in the slate to offer a postgraduate degree programme in management. In most offthese institutes there is dearth of quality management faculty in terms of both numbers and desired qualification. There is, therefore, an urgent need to initiate a programme to develop and train management faculty members. SOM is addressing this need by offering an M. Phil and Ph.D programme in Management. Armed with such a degree, students will be encouraged to take up academics as a career option.

The M. Phil in Management is a two semester program with an intake capacity of 15 students. The first two batches of M.Phil (Management) have been completed and many of the students have already initiated their Ph.D work. The third batch is currently in progress. The admission process to the M.Phil programme is extremely rigorous. SOM, WBUT conducts admission tests / interviews to judge the academic understanding and research potential of the applicants. Admission is based on past academic record, performance of the candidate in the selection process and orientation of the candidate towards research as judged by the panel of interviewers.

5.15 THE BENGAL ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE UNIVERSITY (2004)

'In 1992 the union MHRD declared the Institute as a deemed University under Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956. With effect from 16.02,1993 its management was transferred to a registered Society. Subsequently in 2004 the Institute was transformed into a full fledged State University named Bengal Engineering and Science University, Shibpur through a State legislation.

Apart from being a front ranking national academic institute involved in carrying out cutting edge research, the University has a strong base of industrial research. Headed by the Director of Research the industry institute partnership cell oversees externally funded research projects and extension activities.

Research for Society :

- 1. A very important pilot project on 'Broadband Powerline Communication' (BPL) has been launched by the research group led by Professor Pabitra Kumar Ray, Department of Electronics and Tele-Communication Engineering, in collaboration with CESC, Kolkata. BPL installations were set up in two areas in the eastern part of the city of Kolkata. The investigations on the various aspects of BPL performance, *viz.*, speed at the recipient's end, coverage area, stability, reliability of service and R.F. interference have been yielding consistently encouraging results.
- 2. The Civil Engineering Department helped build arsenic removal system and suitable sanitation system at fifteen high schools in the districts of Nadia and North 24 Parganas. Five community-based arsenic removal units have been installed in Nadia and North 24 Parganas districts; till date more than 200 such filters have been installed.
- 3. The University has developed domestic fluoride removal unit for village applications. UNICEF and Dept. of Panchayat, Govt. of WB have taken up the technology of the filter to promote it in the affected districts of West Bengal through Rural Sanitary Marts.
- 4. Using a novel technology BESU has installed the first community-level defluoridation units in Rampurhat-I block of West Bengal; the unit is showing promising results.

UNIVERSITIES

- 5. The department of civil engineering, has been nominated as the project facilitating agency for the international project on "Development and Application of Potentially Important Jute Geo-textiles" funded by "Common Fund for Commodities (CFC)", the Netherlands.
- 6. The faculty and students in electronics and telecommunication engineering department have developed a novel sensor for detection of bacteria. Work on development of advanced steel for defence applications by the faculty of metallurgy department found applications in defence productions.

Central Library

Having moved to the newly constructed library building "The Central Library' has started functioning from there in August 2009. To facilitate use of e-resources like ASCE, ASME and IEL Online, the library has set-up an e-reading room. From January 2010, the Library is getting access of Springer's LINK and JSTOR database through UGC-INFONET Digital Library consortium and Elsevier's Science Direct from its own resources. Process is underway to enhance the authorised users of IEL Online by five times.

Highlights of the activities during 2010-2011

New Collaborations

- (a) Metalogic Systems Pvt Ltd Kolkata has created a Chair Professor in memory of Prof S S Baral, former Head and founder of Electronics and Tele communication Engineering Department. A 'Software Innovation Centre' has been launched jointly with Metalogic Systems Pvt. Ltd., Kolkata who will also undertake construction of a building for the purpose.
- (b) As research collaboration, BESU, jointly with Queen's University, Belfast, (QUB), UK and IEMS (Jamshedpur), received the prestigious DelPHE project from British Council. Dr. Kalyan Bhar and Dr. Anirban Gupta visited QUB and one research scholar of QUB will work for six months at BESU for carrying out doctoral research. A team of Professors under the leadership of Vice Chancellor of QUB, UK visited BESU and inaugurated BESU-QUB collaborative research centre.
- (c) In collaboration with Windsor University, Canada a postgraduate programme in Automotive Engineering is to be started shortly; A CIDA project for the same is under an advanced stage of consideration.

- (d) As a part of collaboration with the University of Pennsylvania, USA, three Students of UPenn worked in an arsenic remediation project at the civil engineering department of this university and Dr. Anirban Gupta has been offered a visiting professorship by the UPenn.
- (e) A collaborative research project on arsenic remediation has been taken up with the Lehigh University, USA. BESU and Lehigh University together shared three international awards on arsenic remediation and researchers of these two universities authored five technical papers jointly.
- (f) International fundings have been received for arsenic removal projects from Water for People, Denver, USA and DFID, UK through DelPHE grant of British Council. A major grant for research on fluoride-removal has been received from UNICEF.
- (g) The DST, Govt. of India, has granted an International collaborative project under the scheme "CP-STIO" (Collaborative Project with Scientists and Technologists of Indian Origin settled abroad) involving BESU, IIT-Roorkee, and University of Arizona, Tucson, USA, with Dr Subrata Chakraborty as its Principal Investigator. Under this scheme Prof. Achintya Haldar of the University of Arizona visited BESU during December 26,2009 to January 16,2010 and delivered a series of lectures on "Uncertainty and Reliability".
- (h) CEERI Pilani is going to set up a 'Microelectronics Fabrication Centre' at the Department of Electronics and Tele communication Engineering of this University.
- (i) The School of Ecology, Infrastructure and Human Settlement Management has undertaken a collaborative Research project on "Implementing Sustainable Behaviour through Sediment Husbandry in West Bengal Sunderbans' with Queen's University Belfast, UK.
- (j) The Ministry of Steel has granted a 'Steel Chair Professor' and also offered five scholarships to the students pursuing bachelor's programme in Metallurgy and Materials Engineering at BESU. Earlier Tata Golden jubilee Chair Professor was instituted by Tata Steel.

Since 1979, an Educational and Research establishment had been operative at Pundibari under Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya as a part of its constituent units. MISSION

The State Government notified the establishment of the University for the purposes of affiliating, teaching, ensuring proper and systematic instruction, training in Modern system of Medicine, Homoeopathic system of Medicine, Ayurvedic system of Medicine, Unani system of Medicine, Nursing Education, Pharmacy Education, Dental Education, Education on Laboratory Technology, Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy and Education on other Paramedical courses. This University will act as a specialized autonomous institution with the objective to promote academic freedom, scholarship for teachers as well as for the students and to foster and develop an intellectual climate conducive to the pursuit of scholarship and excellence, either independently or jointly with other centers of excellence of higher learning.

Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute has been established as a self financing Deemed to be university. The Ministry of Human Resource Devolopement, Government of India accorded permission to the Ramkrishna Mission to start a deemed [to be] university (under University Grants Commission Act) named Ramkrishna Mission Vivekanda Educational and Reasearch Institute by a Gazatte Notification dated 5 January 2005. Later, by another Notification of the UGC, the University was renamed as 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekanda University'. To start with, major thurst areas were chosen because these have received little emphasis in any of the other conventional universities in India. They are thus the gap areas in which the present university would operate.

6.2.2 IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University)

6.2.2.1 A NEW CONCEPT

The concept of an open University is an important innovation of the last century. It aims to bring about revolutionary changes in the system of learning through DISTANCE EDUCATION.

The first open University ('The Open University') was established in England in 1969.

IGNOU was established by an Act of Parliament in 1985 to achieve the following objectives :

- To democratise higher education by taking it to the doorsteps of the students.
- To provide access to high quality education to all those who seek it irrespective of age, religion or formal qualification.
- To offer need-based academic programmes by giving professional and vocational orientation to the courses.
- To promote and develop DISTANCE EDUCATION.
- To set and maintain standards in DISTANCE EDUCATION in the country as an apex body.

6.2.2.2 DISTANCE EDUCATION AND OPEN LEARNING

Distance Education is often confused with Correspondence Education. The distinction between Correspondence Education and Distance Education lies in their aims, methods and orientation. Correspondence Education is an extension of conventional education. Distance Education aims at varied goals. These include personal growth, training for better job prospects and job enhancement, a change in attitude, etc., in addition to imparting knowledge. Distance Education allows learning at one's own pace and offers easy entry and exit points. It makes life-long learning a reality. Distance Education employs a multimedia learning package. It is characterised essentially by the advanced learning strategies effected by modern communication technology. Correspondence Education, on the other hand, depends mostly on printed materials distributed by post.

The President of India is the Visitor of the University. The authorities of the University include the Board of Management, Academic Council, Planning Board, Finance Committee, etc.

The University follows the multimedia approach in imparting instruction. It comprises :

- Interactive Satellite Aided Communication Network (Teleconferencing)

6.2.2.5 STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Support services are provided through a network of Study Centres scattered all over the country. Study Centres are the actual focal points where the learners receive regular information and learning support. Each Study Centre is provided with library, audio and video facilities for the students. Senior and experienced academics and professionals are engaged in face-to-face counselling to further help them in the learning process. The Study Centres are generally located in existing educational institutions and normally function on holidays and Sundays and in the evening on working days. Each Study Centre is manned by part-time staff drawn from the host institution. To co-ordinate the functioning of Study Centres IGNOU has set up 19 Regional Centres in different parts of the country.

6.2.2.6 RECOGNITION

IGNOU is a Central University under the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Govt. of India. The Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates awarded by IGNOU are recognised by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and are at par with Degrees/Diplomas/Certificates of all Indian Universities/Deemed Universities/Institutions vide UGC Circular No : F1-8/92 (CPP) dated February, 1992.

The Directorate of Employment, Govt. of West Bengal has recognised the degrees/diplomas of IGNOU to be at par with the same of other Universities of the country in the matter of providing employment.

The Deptt. of School Education, H.S. Branch, Govt. of West Bengal has issued an Order No.187-SE(HS)/10M-3/97 dated 22nd August, 1997 by strength of which degrees/diplomas offered by IGNOU are acceptable for the purpose of further studies of teachers' training and employment in Schools of West Bengal.

The Reprography Section of the Society, is dealing to the work of making Xerox copies from Books for Reader Service and supplied to various Readers/Scholars of India and Abroad, and documents for official purpose.

Conservation Section

The Conservation Laboratory meant for the preservation and restoration of the Library and Museum materials has performed the following tasks in preserving and restoring manuscripts, rare books and other objects kept in the Museum and Library of the Society.

Publication Section

The Asiatic Society is known to the world of learning mostly because of its publications of high academic standard. The Society has been publishing original and outstanding books periodicals and Booklets which have been able to draw the attention of academic world.

Academic Section

Research works of Fellows with Scholar Supervisors for different projects including outside projects sponsored by the Society deserve mention. Lectures, Seminar, Symposia, Workshops and Training Programme were also held by the Society as a significant part of its academic activities.
OTHER UNIVERSITIES

6.3.7 BOSE INSTITUTE

P1/12, Acharya Prafulla Chandra Road, Kolkata-700 009.

The Bose Institute was founded by Acharya Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose in 1917 for the advancement of science and dissemination of knowledge. The Institute has served the nation for the past 85 years through its pursuit of advancement of knowledge in science and technology. There are departments of Biochemistry, Biophysics, Botany, Microbiology, Chemistry and Physics and the research sections on Animal Physiology, Environmental Science, Immunotechnology and Plant Molecular & Cellular Genetics. In addition, there are support and service centres like RSIC, DIC, Library, Workshop etc.

Research Activities

The research programmes of the Biochemistry Department include studies for the basic understanding of gene expression in plants and bacteria, plant and animal biotechnology, yeast and parasite molecular biology, structure-activity relationship proteins and structural biology.

The major theme of the Biophysics Department is structure, function and dynamics of biomolecules. The research interests are mainly focused on proteins, nucleic acids and small pharmacologically active compounds.

The major research goal of Botany Department established in 1917 is to improve crop productivity using conventional and modern techniques, where genes with elite characters particularly those endowed with biotic and abiotic stress tolerance are identified and located in wild relatives, with an objective to incorporate those in cultigens of rice, Brassica, Beta and Chenopodium using breeding, tissue culture and genetic engineering techniques.

The programmes of the Chemistry Department are centred around studies on biomolecules. The major objective is to understand the chemical and biochemical nature of these molecules and gain information about their roles in biological processes.

The research activities of the Microbiology Department address mainly the problems in the areas of parasitic and bacterial infections, drug design, detoxification, plant-microbe and mineral-microbe interactions.

The Physics Department is one of the oldest departments in the Institute, as the founder himself was a physicist. The main objective of this department is to improve our understanding of the basic laws of nature, in the realm of both macro and micro worlds.

The Research Section on Animal Physiology was established in1930 with the objective of understanding basic amphibian, piscine and invertebrate physiology, reproductive physiology, drug research and nutrition.

The section on Environmental Sciences created in1992 mainly deals with studies on Air, Noise, Water, Land and Biological environment and provide consultancy services to Industries. The section extends consultancy work on Quality Control, Monitoring and Control and Environmental Pollution at the local and national level.

The Immunotechnology section was created in 1992. Newly introduced programmes include an effect to understand phage induced modifications and inactivation of host aminoacyl tRNA synthetase, and a study of white spot syndrome associated baculovirus affecting shrimp aquaculture in India.

The Plant Molecular & Cellular Genetics section was established in 1989 with the objective of studying basic and applied aspects of plant processes through modern molecular approaches.

6.3.8 INDIAN INSTITUTE OF CHEMICAL BIOLOGY4, Raja S. C. Mullick Road, Kolkata-700 032(Established in the year 1935)

The Indian Institute of Chemical Biology has always focussed basic research in Bio-Medical science. Over the years, it has endeavoured to attain excellence in basic biological research and to focus attention on applied research.

MAIN AREAS OF ACTIVITY :

Leishmaniasis, Vibrio Cholerae, Developmental Neurobiology and Neurological Disorders, Cell Biology, Reproductive Biology, Chemistry of Bio-active Substances, Immunobiology and Immunochemistry, Protein Engineering and Structural Biology, Bio-technology, Theoretical Biology and Modelling of Bio-systems, Drug Designing and Molecular modelling.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- Understanding the molecular basis of pathogenicity of parasitic and bacterial diseases of national importance. Development of early diagnostic methods and immunoprophlactic measures.
- Investigation of the role of thyroid hormones in brain development. Mechanisms of genesis of the features of Parkinson's disease and clinical studies of early diagnosis of the disease as also monitoring of drug therapy.
- Identification and characterization of bioactive materials from natural sources synthesis of new molecules and exploration of their usefulness as potential drugs.
- Mapping of small genomes and sequencing.

OTHER UNIVERSITIES

- Studies on human genetics of the Indian subcontinent. Identification of disease genes and gene therapy.
- Development of radiopharmaceuticals for diagnosis of different functional disorders.
- Development of diagnostic kits for determination of hormonal disorders.
- Understanding the molecular mechanisms of cellular regulation in gastric hyperacidity and ulceration, muscular dystrophy and related abnormalities.

6.3.9 SATYENDRA NATH BOSE NATIONAL CENTRE FOR BASIC SCIENCES Block JD, Sector III, Salt Lake, Kolkata - 700 091.

The Satyendra Nath Bose National Centre For Basic Sciences was established in 1986 to foster the growth of advanced studies in selected branches of basic sciences and to conduct original researches in theoretical and mathematical sciences and other basic sciences in frontier areas including challenging theoretical studies of future application and to train young scientists for basic researches.

Main Programmes are :

Theoretical Physics, Applied Mathematics, Mathematical Modeling and Theoretical Chemistry. This centre has been maintaining an excellent standard in research activities, conducting various seminars and collaborating programmes with different universities in and outside the country. Some of the research projects undertaken :

Electronic structure of random alloys, Nuclear Fission and Nuclear structure calculation, Probing the foundation of Quantum Theory, High-Tc Super conductors-effects of radiation damage, Liquid Crystals, Statistical mechanics-theory of sand piles and aggregates.



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CHAPTER – 7

COLLEGES

7.1 GENERAL INFORMATION ON GOVERNMENT AND NON-GOVERNMENT COLLEGES:

There are different categories of College in West Bengal like Govt. colleges, non Govt. colleges under pay packet scheme and private self financing colleges under the administrative jurisdiction of the Higher Education Department. They include General Degree Colleges and professional colleges like Law Colleges, Teachers' Training Colleges, Management colleges and Engineering & Technological Colleges etc. Districtwise distribution of various category of colleges has been shown here.

General Degree Colleges in this State are under two broad categories(i) Government Colleges and (ii) Non-Government Colleges. Self financing private colleges have also been set up in this area.

Government Colleges are directly controlled by the State Government. The entire expenditure for these Colleges is borne by the Higher Education Department. The teaching and non-teaching staffs of these Colleges are Government employees.

The Non-Government Degree Colleges are also financed by the Higher Education Department almost entirely. In 1978, the PAY PACKET SCHEME was introduced for payment of salary of teaching and non-teaching employees of the Colleges under the West Bengal Colleges (Payment of Salaries) Act, 1978. All Non-Government degree colleges (including erstwhile sponsored colleges) receive salary under this scheme. Recently the State Govt. has allowed a few autonomous non-profit making societies/trusts to set up a few private colleges on self-financing basis. The General Degree Colleges have a wide variety in enrolment, subjects offered and in educational achievements.

General Degree College:

At present there are 449 Gen Deg. Colleges [excluding erstwhile Presidency College, Raiganj Univ. College, and 3 proposed Govt. Gen Deg. Colleges at Bhabta, Dt. Murshidabad, Rajarhat, 24 Prgs (N) & Gaighata, 24 Prg (N)] distributed all over the state. Out of these colleges the total number of Govt., Pay Packet & Private Colleges are 17, 410 and 22 respectively. A district-wise break up of these colleges is given below.

The Department feels that Honours teaching facility should be evenly distributed in the districts amongst various subjects in Arts, Science and Commerce Groups. Efforts are being made to move in that direction.

In the case of extension of affiliation to new subjects in the existing colleges, the infrastructure of the particular college, its teaching strength, academic record as evidenced by examination results,

location, area served, etc. are taken into consideration. Special importance is also given for according affiliation to new subjects in colleges, which have a higher SC/ ST student population. A number of Govt. and Non-Govt. Colleges have been given extension of affiliation in respect of new subjects during 2008-2009. Some colleges have more than one shift on account of student population.

Most of the sciences teaching colleges teach physical sciences (Physics/Chemistry). Life Sciences (Botany/Zoology/Physiology) are taught in less number of colleges. Subjects like Statistics, Geology, Computer Science, Electronics, etc. are taught in a limited number of colleges although there is a great demand for those subjects. In view of the above, the Higher Education Department has been granting affiliation for Computer Science and Electronics in several colleges at both the General and the Honours level.

It may be noted from the following table that only 207 colleges offer teaching in Commerce. As regards districtwise distribution of these colleges, the percentage is high (i.e. more than 60%) in only 5 districts, namely, Howrah, Hooghly, Burdwan, Birbhum, Nadia and South 24 Parganas.

Number of Girls' Colleges in districts with Hostel facility

There are girls' colleges in all districts except Cooch Behar, North Dinajpur and Purulia. The oldest Girls' College in the State is Bethune College, which was established in 1879. Besides the abovementioned colleges, there are some professional colleges (Teachers' Training / Fine Arts/ Home Science etc.) which are meant for girls' students only. There are some co-education colleges with facility of Girls' Hostel.

7.2 GAMES AND SPORTS IN COLLEGES

FACILITIES

Although games and sports are not included in regular curricular programme of General Degree Colleges, the Government encourages these activities in various ways. There are posts of Physical Instructor/ Physical Instructress in all Government Colleges and in some Non-Government Colleges. They are entrusted with the responsibility of organising games and sports in respective colleges. Grants are released to colleges for purchase of equipment for games and sports.

GOVERNMENT COLLEGES

Most of the Govt. Colleges have playgrounds within or outside. The students of the colleges are encouraged to participate in games and sports. An INTER-GOVT. COLLEGE ATHLETIC MEET is held every year.

NON-GOVERNMENT COLLEGES

The picture of the non-Govt.colleges is slightly different. It is understood from available data that 105 colleges have playground attached to those colleges, while 25 colleges have playground outside the campus. But the playgrounds of most of those colleges are not spacious enough for popular games like football or cricket. Like Govt. Colleges, inter non-Govt. College athletic meet and Football competition is organised by the Directorate of Physical Education annually.

7.3 HOSTEL FACILITIES IN COLLEGES

All the Government Engineering and Technological Colleges have hostel facility. All the Govt. Teachers' Training Colleges, excepting one, also have this facility. Amongst the Govt. General Degree Colleges, however, only ten colleges have hostels. Amongst the non-Govt. (General Degree and Teachers' Training) colleges, ninety three colleges offer this facility. The number of non-Govt. colleges in each district having hostel facility is shown at next page :

Ford Foundation, UGC, DST -Gol, CSIR, etc, have funded special research and academic projects in top government colleges. Presidency College alone has received nearly Rs.5 cr. Libraries, Laboratories and Computer systems have been upgraded to enhance research and other academic facilities.

✤ Created financial flexibility :

The Principal's of the Govt. Colleges have been given the financial powers of DPI/Secretary for sanctioning expenditure. They do not have to approach HE Deptt/DPI for these matters, as was the system before.

B. Non-Government Colleges

Beside the Government Colleges, the State at present has 803 Non-Government Colleges of different categories of which 419 are non-Government General Degree Colleges. Serampore College, established in 1818 under the initiative of the Danish Government is the oldest. It thus coincides with the year of establishment of Hindu College (later Presidency College) in Calcutta. It was followed by Krishnanath College (1858), St. Xaviers' College (1860), St. Paul's College (1865) and Midnapore College (1873). The establishment of the colleges was, in some cases, associated with the National (Education) Movement in India during the British period, such as Surendranath College (1884) and Jadavpur Vidyapith (now Jadavpur Vidyapith College of Education).

Since Independence, the Central and the State Governments have appointed various commissions in the field of education, the University Education Commission, 1948-49, the Indian Education Commission (Kothari Commission), 1964-66 and the Education Commission (Ashok Mitra Commission), 1992-93 etc. for the improvement of education and the service conditions of the Non-Government College teachers which were not at par with those of the Government Colleges teachers. Various effective steps have been taken for the improvement of the service conditions of teachers of Non-Government Colleges since the Left Front Government came into power in 1977, which include :

- As there was no security in service of College teachers and the payment of their salary was irregular, the present Government, after assumption of power, passed the West Bengal College (Payment of Salaries) Act, 1978 by which the security of service and the payment of salaries were ensured by the State Government. The Pay Packet Scheme is administered by Education Directorate.
- The Governing body of the Non-Government Colleges was democratized by the inclusion of elected representatives of the teaching and the non-teachings staff of the college.
- Previously the non-Government Colleges had to deposit 50% of their income in the Government Exchequer against the total payment of salary by the State Government. But the Government has waived this deposit.

- Similarly, Death-cum-Retirement benefit scheme was sanctioned for teachers of Non-Government Colleges in 1978. In 1993-94 an enhanced rate of pension and other benefits were sanctioned for teachers who had opted for them, making the benefits at par with those of the Government College teachers. A Pension Cell is attached to the Pay Packet Section of the Education Directorate to look after the payment of the Retirement Benefits of the Non-Government College teachers. Recently (2005-06) Govt. has taken urgent steps to clear the backlogs in pension related cases.
- Setting up of new departments/affiliation of new subjects in the emerging areas.
- Setting up of new courses/programme on self financing basis.
- Professional and vocational courses in collaboration with different organisations/institutes.

Expansion and Quality improvement :

The State Government has concentrated on the decentralization of educational opportunities to the rural and other backward areas of the State to meet the demands of the people for education. The State Government is equally conscious of the need for improvement of the quality of college education. Every year the State Government has been sanctioning grants for the development of libraries and laboratories of the Colleges. Funds are also released for the repair, reconstruction/ renovation and extension of college buildings.

The responsibility of management of non-Government colleges lies with the Governing Bodies of the colleges subject to overall jurisdiction of the State Govt. The academic matters of the Colleges are looked after by the University concerned to which the colleges are affiliated.

C. Assessment & Accreditation through National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC):

State Quality Assurance Cell under the aegis of W.B. State Council of Higher Education has been organizing workshops and sensitization programmes for the colleges for NAAC accreditation. As per NAAC-stipulation 342 colleges in our State are eligible for "NAAC-Accreditation" - out of these colleges, (till 15/12/2010) 232 Gen. Deg. colleges are accredited by NAAC for the first time. However, in addition to above, 15 Training (B.Ed.) colleges/ institutions, 1- Art college and 2-Technical colleges are also accredited by the NAAC.

As on 15/12/2010, 8- Gen. Deg. Colleges are Re-Accredited by NAAC.

Placement of Teachers in Non-Government Colleges

Part-Time Teachers (PTT) & Contractual Whole Time Teachers (CWTTs)

To meet the increasing demands for teaching staff in Govt. & State Aided Gen. Deg. Colleges since 2005 State Govt. took the initiative to extend grants in aid to these colleges to partially meet the financial burden towards payment of PTTs. Later on, w.e.f. 01/4/2009 the entire financial responsibility towards payment of PTTs has been shouldered by the State. A three tire pay structure of Rs. 7000/-, 8000/- & 10000/- depending on the length of service of the PTTs was also introduced. During 2009-10 F.Y., Rs. 37.14 crore was allotted to 339 Govt aided colleges and 16 Govt colleges for payment of remuneration of 5227 PTTs. For the F.Y. 2010-11 Rs. 12.63 crore has so far been allotted to 232 colleges for payment of remuneration of 4315 PTTs. The process is still continuing.

Later, w.e.f. 01/10/2010 a more comprehensive scheme for the PTTs was introduced in which the rates of remuneration of PTTs have been raised from Rs. 7000, 8000 & 10000/- to 9450, 10800 & 13500/- respectively. In terms of this scheme the age of superannuation of PTTs has been stipulated to be 60yrs along with some other retiral benefits and leave rules. As per the new scheme a total of Rs.22.18 crore is being allotted (till mid June, 2011) to 230 colleges towards remuneration of 3638 PTTs.

Beside the PTTs a new scheme for Contractual Whole Time Teachers (CWTTs) only for Govt. aided college (under PPS) has also been introduced w.e.f. 4/1/2011, stipulating a fixed monthly remuneration of Rs. 21,400/- only and other benefits similar to those for PTTS. Till 30/05/11 applications from 151 colleges (involving 755 CWTTs) have been received for which Rs.19.39 crore is being released.

Performance cum need based incentive scheme :

This scheme was introduced for Govt aided general deg. Colleges, since F.Y. 2007-08 with wide circulation of the notice through mail as well as advertisement in leading newspapers. Generous financial assistance (to the tune of Rs. 6 to 10 Lacs) is sanctioned for development of infrastructure (viz. Chemicals & glasswares, Books & journals, Lab Equiments & computers, Furniture and minor repairing works). The scheme is based on on-spot assessment of overall performance and requirement of individual colleges scaled in respect of the socio-economic-cum- geographic reference plan on which these colleges are located. Till date applications from nearly 240 colleges have been received from time to time. The total amount disbursed among 205 colleges, till date is Rs.18.08 crore.



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PROFESSIONAL COURSES

Apart from Engineering & Technology Education leading to B.E./B.Tech. & M.E./M.Tech./MCA courses and the Management programme leading to MBA/MBM/PGDBM etc. conducted in Engineering & Technology and Management Institutions, DOEACC accredited Computer courses (O, A & B level), B.C.A. are also imparted in a number of General Degree Colleges, in a few universities and in some other institutions.

In addition to the above, Professional courses like Law Education, Teachers training including Physical Education, Art Education, Music, Home Science etc. are conducted in different professional institutions as detailed below :

PROFESSIONAL COURSES

8.1 TEACHERS' TRAINING

Secondary Teacher Education Programme in West Bengal :

At present B. Ed. courses are run in 5 different categories of institutions in our state viz. (i) Govt. B.Ed. College, (ii) B.Ed. Colleges under PPS, (iii) General Degree Colleges under PPS with B.Ed. Deptt., (iv) Self financed Pvt. B.Ed. Colleges and (v) University B.Ed. Deptts.

There are 135 institutions offering B.Ed. course in our state with an annual intake of nearly 13,500 students. All of these courses are recognized by NCTE. Amongst these institutions there are 7 Govt. B. Ed. Colldges; 17 - B.Ed. Colleges under PPS; 14 - General Degree Colldeges under PPS with B.Ed. Deptt.; 6 - Univesity B.Ed. Depts (including one at Viswa Bharati Univ.) & 91 - Self financed Pvt. B.Ed. Colldges.

At present 95% of the Teacher Education Institutions / colleges are recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). In this achievement, the responsibility of compensatory money was borne by the Govt. of West Bengal.

However, with this status in almost all the Teacher Education Colleges there have been a remarkable infrastructural development in -

- Establishment and development of laboratories in different subjects viz.
 - 1. Educational Technology Laboratory
 - 2. Psychology Laboratory
 - 3. Mathematics Laboratory
 - 4. Language Laboratory
- Introduction of Academic Programme sponsored by Ministry of Human Resource Development in the Teacher Education Colleges in West Bengal -

1. The College Teacher Education (CTE)-

The four B.Ed Colleges have been upgraded to Centre for College Teacher Education (CTE) to conduct in-Service Teacher Education Programme- in previous years are :

- i) Institute of education for Women Hastings House, Alipore, Kolkata;
- ii) Ramkrishna Mission Sikshana Mandir, Belur Math, Howrah;
- iii) Govt. College of Teacher Education, Banipur, North 24- Parganas;
- iv) Govt, College of Education, Hooghly.

This year Siliguri B. Ed. College & B.Ed. Department, University of Kalyani have been offered the status of CTE. This Program is mainly for developing professionalism in in-service secondary - Teachers.

- The David Hare Training College (DHTC-) is upgraded to The Institute of Advance Study Education (IASE). This IASE programme is for Headmasters/Headmistresses of Secondary Schools and Teacher Educators of Teachers Training Colleges.
- M.Ed course is being taught in two Govt. B.Ed. Colleges The David Hare Training College, Ballygunge Circular Road, Kolkata, Institute of Education for Women Hastings House, Alipore. Kolkata and in Education Department of Calcutta University.
- 4. The DHTC is also conducting Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in Education in Distance Mode under Netaji Subhash Open University.

The Teachers' Training Colleges fall into categories : (a) B.Ed Colleges and (b) Physical Education Colleges.

 - d) 2nd August, 2010 was a special day because on that day the intermural competition was inaugurated for session by Md. Naseem Raja, Director of Sports, Kusthia University. Students performed a nice cultural programme and then the competition inaugurated by hoisting the College Flag.

- e) In External activity our students participated in Inter Govt. Physical Education Training College Kho-Kho competition at Dinhata. They were declared as runners up.
- f) Firdous Khatun, student of M.P. Ed-I shouldered the responsibility as the judge in the National Gymanstics Competiton-2011, in Rajasthan.
- g) Our students participated in Inter College Kho-Kho Competition 2010-11 of University of Calcutta at Rabindra Sarober, Kolkata.
- 2. Development grants for purchase of Books, Equipments, Laboratory equipments etc. for all the Govt. Physical Education institutes for B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. course were sanctioned.
- 3) Funds have been placed for development of infrastructural facilities for N.A.A.C. preparation to Banipur and Hastings House Phy. Edn. College.
- 4) Funds have been placed to "Bengal Brotochari Samity and Manimala Mahakendra" Kolkata for encouraging Physical Education, Health and Sports activities for Children.
- 5) One post of Professor and two Lecturers in Physical Education for M.P.Ed. Streams were created for Hastings House, Alipore.

8.3 LAW EDUCATION

The introduction of law education in India can be traced back to the year 1827 when the course was introduced in Hindu College. When Presidency College came into being in 1855, law education became an important department of the College. Various factors, however, compelled this law department to be abolished in 1884. Ripon College (now Surendranath College) was granted affiliation to teach B. L. in 1885. The next major step in law education of the State was taken when Calcutta University opened its law college in 1909. Since 1970, four more law colleges have come up, along with law colleges at North Bengal and Burdwan Universities. The academic status of law education has however, fluctuated over the decades. Initially, it attracted brilliant scholars and produced most of the legal luminaries of the 19th century. After the First World War, the legal profession became overcrowded. After the Independence, law graduates came to be in high demand due to industrial and commercial growth and the facilities for law education was expanded.

Previously, the study of law comprised 3 year courses but of late, a major innovation has been made by introducing a 5-year integrated course on the recommendations of the All India Bar Council. The course starts beyond the H.S. stage and the first 2 years include, apart from some basic law courses, English, Political Science, History and allied subjects. The last three years are devoted to the teaching of only law subjects.

The West Bengal University of Juridical Science was formally inaugurated on 22nd April 2000. The admission to the 5-year Course in law offered by the University is made through an All India Entrance Examination. The present position in legal education in the State is enumerated below in a summary form. Law Colleges have also been established on self financing basis.

8.4 COMPUTER AND IT RELATED PROGRAMME EDUCATION

a) B. C. A. Course

A number of General Degree Colleges affiliated to different universities including Calcutta, Burdwan and North Bengal are conducting BCA Courses. In a few Engineering Colleges affiliated to the West Bengal University of Technology, BCA course has been introduced.

b) Computer Science & Electronics (Hons.) and General Courses

At present B.Sc.(Hons.) course in Computer Science and Electronics is offered in a number of general degree colleges. B.Sc.(General) courses with Computer Science are available in around 50 colleges and with Electronics in about 40 General Degree Colleges. Vocational courses in Computer Application are also available in some colleges.

B.Sc.(Hons.) courses in Internet Science and also in Software Technology affiliated institution have been introduced in a few Colleges of North Bengal University and in Burdwan University.

c) DOEACC Accredited Computer Courses in 'O' 'A' 'B' and 'C' level

- i) Computer Courses in 'O'(Foundation courses), 'A' (PGDCA), 'B' (B.Tech) And 'C' (M.Tech.) level are conducted at the Institute of Computer Engineers (India), Chatterjee International Centre, 33A, Chowringhee Road, Kolkata-700071 and in some other institutions.
- ii) The DOEACC accredited 'O' & 'A' level courses are also conducted by the DOEACC Centre, Kolkata.
- iii) Webel Informatics Ltd. Conduct a series of IT related courses.
- d) *The Netaji Subhas Open University,* in collaboration with the Regional Computer Center, Kolkata, has set up the School of Digital Learning. The School is offering modular courses in Web Application Development, Information Technology and Multimedia Content Development etc.(leading to BCA degree), on a pilot basis at its premises in Gol Park,Calcutta-700 029.
- e) Jadavpur University has introduced a number of short term courses in Multimedia, IT and related areas.

8.5 ART EDUCATION

There are four Art Colleges in the State; one of them is a Government College, one is a Non-Government College, supported by the Government for its maintenance and other two are self financing institute are College of Art & Design, Krishnasayer, Burdwan and Medinipur Art College (4yr BVA), Medinipur Paschim.

ACTIVITIES OF WINGS OF THE GOVERNMENT, ACADEMIES AND INSTITUTES

9.1 INSTITUT DE CHANDERNAGOR

Strand Road, Chandannagar, Hooghly, Phone-(003) 2683-9661

The Museum was established under Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India in 1952 at Former French Governor's Residence "Dupleix Palace" for fulfillment the Article no. IX of the Treaty of Cession which was signed between France and India on 2nd February, 1951. The aims of the Institute are to promote the Culture, Education and Heritage of two Nations Republic of India and France at Chandernagore.

This Museum was reoriented with three wings Museum, Library and French Language courses under the name Indo – French Cultural Centre and Museum (Institut de Chandernagor) popular name "French Institute" under the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal G.O. no. 61Edn dt. 13th January, 1966.

The Archaeological Survey of India declared the buildings and property of the institute as a Protected Ancient Monument of National Importance, the final notification being published in the Gazette of India on 4th March, 2003.

The Governing Body was constituted under the Chairmen ship of His Excellency the Governor, West Bengal and Vice Chairman the Hon'ble Minister in Charge, Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal among with twenty three other higher Ex - Officio members - Central, State, French Government and Educationist vide G.O. no. 8Edn (H/SE) 5I – 2/1994 dt. 13th January, 2006.

The 8th Governing Body meeting was held on 14th June, 2010 under the Chairmanship of His Excellency the Governor, West Bengal at Raj Bhavan, Kolkata. In the Governing Body meeting, the projects of "Regional Institute" under Collaboration with the Govt. of India and State Government and establishment of "Conservation Laboratory" project in financial sharing between state and Central Government have been approved.

ACADEMIES AND ORGANISATIONS

The Higher Education Department has pursued the project of "Regional Institute" to the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India for approval of financial assistance in the ratio 50:50 between State Govt. and Central Govt. for fulfillment the conditions of Article no. IX of Treaty of Cession 1951, vide memo no. 139/ EH/SE/10C – 01/2010 dt. 03.08.2010.

After approval of the Finance Department, the project of the "Conservation Laboratory" was moved to the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India for financial assistance in the ratio 80:20 between Central Govt. and State Govt. memo no. 217/EH/SE/10 C - 02/2010 dt. 23.11.2010.

Temporary exhibition

The year 2010 is very important the 150th birth of Rabindra Nath Tagore. In this connection, the 15th August, 2010, temporary exhibition was organized on "Rabindra Nath Tagore and role of Indian Freedom movement" for 7 days at auditorium. Second Exhibition was organized on "Life of Rabindra Nath Tagore and his philosophy" to display more than 150 rare photographs and descriptive charts on 26th January, 2011 at auditorium for 15th Days.

A) Search Committee for appointment of full time Director.

After decision of the Governing Body Meeting a Search Committee was constituted vide G. O. no. 123/EH/SE/10M – 06/2009 dt. 31.08.2009 to recommend the qualification, experience, Salary and other perquisites and selection process of Full time Director appointment of Institut de Chandernagor under the Chairmanship of Prof. Barun De, Chairman, West Bengal Heritage Commission.

According to recommendation of Search Committee the post of full time Director was created in the scale of Pay Rs. 37,400 to 67,000.00 Grade Pay 10,000.00 under modification G.O. no. 06/EH/SE/ 10M – 06/2009 dt. 12.01.2011.

According tot guideline of the Financial Department, Higher Education Department sent the proposal to the register, University of Hyderabad and Prof. Rila Mukherjee to submit application through proper channel to wait for application of Prof. Rila Mukherjee. Also the Higher education Department moved to the Chairman, P.S.C for approval of the recruitment rule to the post of full time Director, Institut de Chandernagor.

B) Selection Committee

The Selection Committee was reconstituted with five members vide G.O. no. 140 Edn(H/SE)1E – 2/ 2006 dt. 04.08.2010 to fill up the vacant posts Clerk cum typist, Library Assistant, Museum Peon. The appointment process is continuing to fill up the vacant posts.

Museum

In the financial year 2010 – 2011, the gallery of the European Settlement of Bengal was fully reoriented. The history of discover India by Vasco da Gama is described with photos and maps by vinyle print. The history of four East India Company – British East India Company (1600), Dutch East India Company (1602), Danish East India Company (1614) & French East India Company (1664) were described important facts with maps and old photos by vinyle print. The trade history of Portuguese from Bandel and history of Royal port "Saptagram" of Bengal were depicted in details in vinyle board.

The French East India Company established a fort name "Fort D' Orleans" in the year 1691 in the central of French Chandernagore between Laldighi and west bank of Hugly. Robert Clive, Chief of the British East India Company attacked Chandernagore on 23rd March, 1757 and defeated French East India Company also demolished the Fort D' Orleans. A diorama (9' x 9' x 4' with four sides and top glass cover) was made by fiber glass in three dimensions to depict in detail description of fort, life & trade of French East India Company in 17th Century at Chandernagore.

Opening hour

Museum opens for the visitors from 11 – 00 A.M. to 5-30 P.M. except weekly holidays (Thursday and Saturday) and Govt. holidays.

The Entry fee was introduced vide G.O. no. 216 – Edn(H/SE)/10C – 01/10 dt. 22nd November, 2010 at the following rates Indian Nationals Rs. 5.00 per head & Foreigners Rs. 20.00 per head which was introduced 1st January, 2011.

Institut earned revenue Rs. 18, 365.00 from the source of entry fee of three months.

Library

Officially the library was established on 13th January, 1966 by the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal. The library has a total collection of books of about 18000 (eighteen thousand) in three languages, 6300 in French, 5800 in English and the rest Bengali. The collection in French language is very rich, especially the part donated by the French Government, which consists of works of French Authors-a series of publications from 16th to 20th centuries, Corneille, Racine, Ronsard, Molière, Rousseau, Emile Zola , Gerard de Nerval, Balzac, Andre Gide, Albert Camus, Lamartine, Madame de Sevigne, Gustave Flaubert, Montaigne, Mousset, Marcel Proust, Spinoza, Tolstoi, Sainte Beuve, Victor Hugo, Voltaire, Saint Simon, Plutarque, Paul Claudel, P. L. Courier, Baudelaire, Paul Verlaine, Jacques Prévert and others.

ACADEMIES AND ORGANISATIONS

Documentation project

A digitization project work is continuing to preserve French Official records of 17th and 18th Century and 52 books were completed in the last financial year.

French Language Study

In 1966, the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal, introduced adult French Language Courses. The courses are comprised of two levels viz. Certificate and Diploma with duration of one (1) year each and comprising of two semesters.

Admission criteria

Minimum eligibility is a pass in Higher Secondary Examination and Higher Education.

Fees structure

Tuition fee is Rs. 65.00 (Rupees sixty five) only per month collected at a time for six (6) months viz. one semester. Admission fee is Rs. 60.00 and Examination fee Rs. 60.00 for the Certificate Course, and Rs. 70.00 for the Diploma Course.

Affiliation of Course

In 1979, the Burdwan University Council has decided that a student who would pass the B.A. Examination and also obtain the French Certificate and Diploma from the Institut de Chandernagor would be treated as having pass the B.A. Examination with French as a combination subject.

Scope of Higher Education

The student who pass the B.A. Examination and also pass the Diploma Part-II Examination from the Institut de Chandernagor can get admitted in the pre-M.A. in French language under Calcutta University.

The West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board was formed as West Bengal Board of Examination for Admission to Engineering Degree Colleges in the year 1962, born out of a concept of holding a common admission test for the Engineering Colleges of the State of West Bengal. The basic purpose was to select candidates for consideration for admission to the State Colleges on the basis of the results of a single competitive examination which would also lead to saving of time, energy and expenditure on the part of the candidates in appearing at number of entrance tests.

Since inception, the Office of the Board had fuctioned from 'Slater Hall' in the campus of Bengal Engineering and Science University, Shibpur (erstwhile known as "Bengal Engineering Collage, Shibpur") till January, 2008. From February, 2008 the office of the Board has been functioning at AQ-13/1, Sec-V, Salt Lake City, Kolkata-700091.

Following Entrance Examinations are at present conducted by the Board at present for admission to different professional courses.

VII. The Library :

With the financial help from the Government of West Bengal the Institute has been able to enrich its collection on Indian National Movement, post-colonial developments in South Asia and Asian relations. The books in Library have also been cataloged, both author-wise and subject-wise.

VIII. Netaji Museum and Centre for Studies in Himalayan Languages, Society and Culture :

The Museum and Centre was set up in the house of Sarat Chandra Bose at Giddhapahar, Kurseong under the aegis of NIAS. Between 1933 and 1935 Sarat Chandra was interned in this house for two years. Netaji himself was interned in this house for seven months in 1936. He again spent a few days in this house in October 1937. Sarat Chandra and his family used to stay in this house frequently after his release from the prison in 1945. Even in the 1950s Bibhabati Devi, wife of Sarat Chandra, spent their holidays in Giddapahar along with her family members, the last occasion being in 1954. Thereafter, for more than three decades the house remained unused, neglected and unattended. In 1996 the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, initiated the process of acquiring the house. Subsequently, the Government of West Bengal restored and renovated the house and handed it to Netaji Institute For Asian Studies, Kolkata. Under the aegis of Netaji Institute For Asian Studies the historic house was converted into Netaji Museum and Centre For Studies in Himalayan Languages, Society and Culture.

On 20 May 2005 Shri Gopalkrishna Gandhi, His Excellency the Governor of West Bengal, opened the picture gallery of the Netaji Museum, designed and developed by the Indian Museum, Kolkata. The Museum is now a site of popular attraction for tourists and local residents alike.

9.5 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N. S. S.)

The National Service Scheme is a noble Youth activity and main objective of N.S.S is 'Education through Community Service'. The Scheme was launched in 1969 and West Bengal is one of the first few States where N.S.S. has been introduced since its inception in the country. At present, 95,000 student volunteers at University/College/H.S. Schools in West are engaged.

- 1. The fund for N.S.S. regular activities and special camping by the State Govt. (State share) are released in time, the A/cs with the Govt. of India are now settled upto the year 2007-08.
- 2. All the State Universities and H.S. Council conduct their regular Advisory Committee meeting for monitoring and supervising the N.S.S. activities.
- 3. Govt. sanction fund for conducting special workshop for the programme officers and volunteers every year on the theme "National Integration", "Healthy youth for Healthy India", "Environment enrichment", "Women development and gender justices". "Disaster management" Relief and Rehabilitation etc" as a special programme, so that the youth are motivated to community service in the state.
- 4. West Bengal N.S.S. contingent participate in R.D. Parade, National Integration camp, Youth festivals, Mega camp on different theme regularly and receives special thanks and awards for their performance at national level.
- 5. State Govt. have introduced "Felicitations" to N.S.S. functionaries of the State for their remarkable achievements since last three years.
- 6. In continuation of Regular activities; special Ralley, exhibitions, seminars are held on "World Aids Day", "Human Rights Day" etc. and large no. of students and teachers participate in the programme.

9.6 WEST BENGAL DISTRICT GAZETTERS

The office of the State Editor, West Bengal District Gazetteers was set up in the late fifties to implement the Government of India Schemes of revision of Gazetteers which were compiled and published during the British Rule. Since then research, Compilation and publication of Gazetteers have been invoked for long periods. Thereupon many original district reports for making Gazetteers were published. Besides that worthwhile reprints written by different personalities like Hunter, F.D. Ascoli, F.E. Pergiter's reports were also published. But now in view of audit objection for printing, the production of C.D. has been taken into consideration for the report (1) Rivers of Bengal Vol.IV, (2) Sannyasis, Fakirs and Maghs by J.M. Ghosh.

Staff pattern of the office

The staff pattern in this office is quite different from other offices; as this office is a publicationoriented one with its own accounting system; Editorial/Research/Publication Wings; Own Library enriched with precious rare books; own Sales Counter, etc. Having been set up in 1959 at the instance of the Government of India, the office has been writing/compiling/revising/editing and publishing West Bengal District Gazetteers and allied literature, initially under the guidance of the Expert Committee of the Government of India and then the State Advisory Committee.

An Assistant Professor from a Govt. College has joined Gazetteers as Assistant Editor and at prosent is studying in connection with North-Dinajpur Gazetteers. 10 posts mostly that have become irrelevant and impertinent have been surrendered. Two posts that of one librarian and one Junior Editor have been created. Cabinet sanctionhas been approved for recruitment of 4 Research Assistant and 1 Research Officer.

Activities & Achievement during the year :

Publications

1. Publication of Major James Renell's Journal and Atlas as the 4th Volume of Rivers of Bengal :

The West Bengal State Archives is the oldest repository of Government records in the country. It occupies an important place in the set up of the Government of West Bengal since it is the custodian of non-current records created by all Government offices in the State.Besides its primary function of preservation of records, it caters to the needs of bonafide scholers and, as such, plays an important role in generating public awareness about archival source material.At present, it functions from three wings, viz. a) Historical section and main office at 6, Bhawani Dutta Lane, Kolkata- 700 073, which houses records upto 1900, b) Current Section at Writers' Buildings, Kolkata- 700 001, where post-1900 records are preserved and c) New functional Building at 43, Shakespeare Sarani, Kolkata 700 017, which possesses the Intelligence Branch (I.B.) and P.W.D. records. A photo archives and a photo gallery on the freedom fighters have been created in the same premises. A Police Archives wing, led by two senior officials, specially devoted to the tasks of accession and preservation process of I.B. records has functioned as part of the West Bengal State Archives till December, 2010.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE :

Till 11.02.2009, the West Bengal State Archives functioned as a branch office under Higher Education Department of Government of West Bengal, headed by the Director of Archives.Over the last seven years, several requests were formally received from National Committee of Archivists as well as from various eminent historians of the country that for smooth functioning and development of the State Archives, its status should be upgraded to a separate Directorate, in tune with the system already provailing in thirteen other states in the country. On 23.12.2008, a Cabinet decision was taken by the Government of West Bengal in favour of conservation of the West Bengal State Archives to a separate Directorate under the Higher Education Department, and on 11.02.2009, a Government order was issued by Higher Education Department in this regard. Historical section of State Archives at 6, Bhawani Dutta Lane has been declared as the main office of the Directorate.

As mentioned in the Extra Ordinary Gazzete Notification dated 24.07.2009, this newly created Directorate of State Archives has been functioning with twenty seven Group 'A' archival officers, and eighty eight number of Group 'C' and Group 'D' posts belonging to archival cadre.Out of thirty six sanctioned Group 'B' posts, sixteen posts will be filled up by the Director through P.S.C. Out of remaining twenty posts, eight posts have been filled up on deputation basis.

EXHIBITION :

For archival awarness among the common people, the West Bengal State Archives regularly organizes archival exhibition every year. This year, the State Archives has organized archives week celebration

to commemorate 150th birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore and Evolution of State Archives(1910-2010) on and from 6th April- 12th April 2011.

Publication :

Directorate of State Archives has regular publication programme. This year two publications 'Select Docoments on Calcutta 1800-1900' A Tribute to Rabindranath Tagore - Glimpses from Archival Records' have been brought out on 10th April and 17th May 2011 respectively. Two publications entitled 'The Great Revolt of 1857 in Bengal' and 'Evolution of State Archives' are forthcoming.

COMPUTER AND DIGITAL UNIT :

Digitization of 36,000 glass slides photonegatives and photographic print has been completed. Preparation of reference media is going on Date entry according to specific software has been started.

CONSERVATION UNIT :

Conservation of age-old priceless documents is a primary function of State Archives. The work of repairing the records of Home (Political), Municipal Department and Report on Native News Papers are going on.

Inspection of libraries

The State Archives is the recommending authority regarding applications of different libraries and institutions for Central Government Scheme of Financial assistance for preservation of manuscripts and rare books. This year the archival officers have inspected the holdings of the following institutions and State Level Screening Committee has forwarded their applications to the National Archives of India with their recommendations.

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Kothari Commission on 'Media Transfer' to implement the programme of switching over to regional languages as the medium of instruction at the level of Higher Education, Book Boards were formed in different States in the country. Accordingly, in the year 1970 the West Bengal State Foundation for Text Book Borad was formed and registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act.

The authority of general superintendence direction and control of the Society is vested in the Board of Governors of the West Bengal State Book Board. The Minister-in-Charge of Higher Education, West Bengal is the ex-officio Chairman of the Board. The Principal Secretary (Higher Education) to the Government of West Bengal is the Vice-Chairman and the Chief Executive Officer, is the Member-Secretary of the Board.

The maintenance cost of running the Board is borne by the Department of Higher Education of the Government of West Bengal. The Government of India, provides assistance for the publication of text books on the basis of proposals prepared by the Board.

The number of publications of the Board has been on the increase. It rose from 766 in 2000-2001 to 783 in 2002-2003 to 792 in 2003-2004, 801 in 2004-2005, 820 in 2005-2006, 838 in 2006-2007, 845 in 2007-2008, 2008-2009, 863 in 2009-2010 and 901 in 2010-2011.

The Board publishes text books for the use at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels of studies. The publications also cover terminologies, dictionaries and monographs in science for students and general readers.

The academic disciplines in which the Board has so far published books are follows :

In the year under review the Board concentrated on the publication of syllabus oriented text books. In 2002 the University of Calcutta thoroughly revised the syllabus of all subjects and the Board was considered as the principal organisation who are experienced in the publication of such text books. Therefore special efforts were made to constitute subject committees for a couple of subjects. Nearly 14(fourteen) new books and 24(twentyfour) re-edition/reprint are now under the process of printing and will shortly be published by the Board.

In order to reach to the students directly. The Board participates in the Book Fairs in different places both within and outside the State and gets good response there.

The West Bengal College Service Commission came into existence on November 02,1979 in terms of Act LXII of 1978, The main functions of the Commission are :-

- To prepare Merit Panels of eligible candidates for the post of Assistant Professors/ Librarians in different subjects as well as Principal in different Non-Government Colleges affiliated by Calcutta University, West Bengal State University, Burdwan University, Kalyani University, Viddyasagar University, Gour Banga University and North Bengal University and to recommend candidates for appointment as Assistant Professors/ Librarians.
- 2) To conduct University Grants Commission (UGC) Accredited State Eligibility Test (SET), formerly known as SLET for Lectureship in Universities and Colleges of West Bengal as a State Agency.

There are Seven zonal Units of the Commission :

i) Calcutta University Zone; ii) West State University Zone; iii) Burdwan University Zone iv) Kalyani University Zone; v) Vidyasagar University Zone; v) Gour Banga University ; and vii) North Bengal University Zone.

- 2) Every Zonal Unit of the Commission shall consist of the Chairman and two Members of the Commission.
- 3) The members of the zonal unit of the Commission shall render advice to the Chairman in preparing a panel of eligible candidates based on the interviews conducted exclusively for those who have applied for appointment within the zone of the respective Zonal Unit of the Commission.

The advertisement for Selection of Principal of differnet non-govt. colleges was published on 4th January, 2011 and the selection process will start very soon.

The Commission invited requisiton for vacant posts of Assistant Professor/Librarians of different non-govt. colleges. The matter is under process.

The 15th State Eligibility Test for Leatureship wasconducted on 25 July, 2010 and the result was published on 27th September, 2010. A total number of 364 candidates qualified in 23 subjects in 15th SET -2010. The result was approved by the Steering Committee in its Meeting and in presence of U-CAT Menber & Dy. Secretary, NET Bureau, UGC, New Delhi.

Recommendation for Appointment of 1369 Assistant Professors were issued in 2010-11 year. A total number of 5417 Leaturers were recommended from 1997-2007 and a total number of 293 Principals were recommended from 2000-2008.

10.1 BANKIM BHABAN GABESANA KENDRA

The Government of West Bengal in the Department of Higher Education acquired the ancestral property of Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay measuring nearly one acre with covered area 11533.56 sft. The residential buildings and natmandir of the acquired property was heavily dilapidated requiring immediate restoration and renovation. After partial restoration of the building around mid nineteen ninety nine it was decided by the Higher Education Department to establish a Research Centre with some special objectives and in September 1999 a registered Research Centre namely Bankim-Bhavan Gaveshana Kendra was established.

Within a short span of about 10 years the research centre has grown enormously. The restoration work assigned to the Gaveshana Kendra has almost completed and the other hand the contemplated academic projects also progressed considerably. Presently the six majour components of this centre have been running within the edifice; 1. The Museum 2. The Library 3. The Puthi collection 4. Archive 5. Digital Unit and 6. Publication division.

This fast developing academic centre has been affiliated to the newly established West Bengal State University, Barasat.

The Museum

A personalia museum is housed in the Baithak-Khana (Parlour) of Bankim Chandra, built by himself, comprising a hall and two small rooms. Bankim used one of the small rooms as his study. Presently the entire space of the three roomed building being used as the museum displaying various memorials of Bankim Chandra and his family. Mention may be made here that most of his famous literary works and the national song Bandemataram were created in this study room. Hence this portion of Bankim Bhavan bears a special importance in our country's cultural map. Huge display materials collected here could not be arranged properly and to over come the problem of space one three storeyed annexe being built.

The Library

Bankim-Bhavan Gaveshana Kendra received as donation from the chatterjee family a collection of important books and journals. The library of Bhavan started with this small collection but successively received several personal libraries of eminent scholars like Prof. Chinta Haran Chakraborty, Prof. Dilip Kumar Biswas, Prof. Bhabatosh Dutta, and some other. The collection now stands at nearly fourteen thousand and used by scholars from different universities. It has earned a name as the store house of source materials for higher research in humanities, particularly literature and social sciences.

The Puthi Collection

It is known that Bhatpara, Naihati, Halishar area was famous for sanskrit culture in seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. One of the old families cultivating sanskrit knowledge was the family of Mahamohopadhay Haraprasad Shastri. Successors of Shastri family very kindly donated a rich puthi collection containing texts of Nabya Naya, Smriti, Vayakaran and literature. These collections numbering nearly one thousand being processed for compiling a descriptive catalogue.

It be noted that Bankim-Bhavan Gaveshana Kendra is affiliated to the National Manuscript Mission and has being receiving regular assistance from its regional centre at Calcutta University.

Archive

During last few years a huge number of letters, land documents, manuscripts etc. have been collected in Bhavan's Archive. These collections comprise of the papers of Bankim Chandra's family, family of Mahamohopadhay Haraprasad Shastri, famous religious leader Keshab Chandra Sen and the eminent literatteur Samaresh Basu. This institution is affiliated to National Archive and the entire documents being processed for preservation in digital format. Considerable work in this direction has already been accomplished. This archive such as a rich store of materials for study of nineteenth century social and cultural history of Bengal.

Special mention may be made that as many as 46 Gramophone records of Bandemataram Song sung by Rabindra Nath Tagore, Pandit Omkarnath, Ms Subbulakshmi, Maghubai Kurdikar, Dilip Kr. Roy and voices of such other famous singers' are preserved.

Digital Unit

From the very inception of the research centre a strong Digital Unit was established equiped with various modern accessories. The research and publication works of this house receive substantial help from this Digital Unit and valuable documents, rare books and journals are preserved here in digital format.

Publication

Bankim-Bhavan Gaveshana Kendra has already established itself as a serious centre for research and publication of our country. Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay started publishing his famous journal Bangadarshan from this house in the year 1872. Subsequently this journal had been published by Sanjib Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rabindranath Tagore, Mohitlal Majumder etc. This journal has been revived and being published anew again from this very house. Already 13 (Thirteen) Volumes have been published, of which mention may be made of special numbers on Niharranjan Roy, Binodbihari Mukhopadhyay, Bishnu Dey. The ensuing 14th issue being planned as commemorative issue on one of our great artists Somenath Hore. Eminent personalities like Annada Sankar Roy, Dr. Rabindra Kr. Dasgupta Prof. Dilip Kr. Biswas, Dr. Bhabatosh Dutta had been associated with this publication as advisors and at pressent eminent Oxford Scholar Prof. Tapan Roy Chaudhury , Prof. Saroj Bandhopadhyay, Sri Nirendra Nath Chakraborty, Syed Mustafa Siraj, Sri Shankha Ghosh, Sri Debesh Roy have been associated with Bangadarshan as advisors.

On invitation the Research Fellow of Bankim-Bhavan Gaveshana Kendra, Dr. Bijali Sarkar attended a National Seminar organised by Nikhil Bharat Banga Sahitya Sammelan (Burnpur Branch) held at Burnpur on 26.12.2010 and inaugurated by Hon'ble Finance Minister Sri Pranab Mukherjee to celebrate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore and Dr. Bijali Sarkar presented a very interesting paper on Political thought of Rabindranath.

Report of activities on proposed Museum at 10 Lake Terrace

Following advice of the Ministry of Culture Government of India, the CSSSC was engaged in preparation of detailed proposal for proposed Jadunath Sarkar Museum at 10 Lake Terrace under the Small Museum creation scheme of the Government. The Ministry extended a financial aid of INR 500,000/- based on the merit of preliminary application submitted by the CSSSC and its defense in Delhi in the month of November 2009.

Based on specifications suggested by the expert committee of the Ministry of Culture the CSSSC has further detailed the application for funding with special focus on curatorial design and on conservation. Two Research Assistants appointed for the work of cataloguing and short-listing of exhibits for thematic display, and Professor Tapati Guha-Thakurta, with inputs from Kamalika Mukherjee and Alleya and Associates, the firm appointed for preparation of the DPR finalized the part.

The CSSSC approached Professor Uday Narayan Singh, the then Director of Rabindra Bhavan, Visva Bharati to appoint an expert panel to judge and comment on the conservation retrieval guidelines set by the Documentation Officer of the CSSSC and a two member panel visited CSSSC to inspect physical copies of the printed articles and photographs and submitted a detailed feasibility report, which basically supported CSSSC's initial proposal of selective preservation.

The detailed Application kit has been re-submitted to the Ministry on 27th September 2010.

Report of activities of the Urban History Documentation Archive of the CSSSC

During the period the archive of the CSSSC acquired about 450 reproduced images of Shanu Lahiri's works from the Artist. Also an interesting collection has been deposited to CSSSC archive as part of special arrangement with India Foundation for Arts and the collection is a set of 1832 items of cartons and caricatures printed in vernacular newspapers and magazines published from West Bengal in India and Bangladesh.

The process of digitization of the Amrita Bazar Patrika is on and during the period about 30,000 pages of the newspaper from 1912 to 1946 have been digitized.

To commemorate the Birth Centenary of Acharya J. C. Bose, India's first modern scientist, this unique institution was conceptualized in the year 1958 by visionaries like Dr. B. C. Roy, Sir Jehangir Ghandy, Sir R. Mudaliar and other noted educationists and industrialists. The program was inaugurated by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. JBNSTS is an autonomous Registered Society under West Bengal Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 (No. S/4353 of 1960-61), promoted by the Government of West Bengal and administered by a Governing Body with representatives from the Government, Academics and Industry. It enjoys status of a special institution as declared by Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. Presently, Dr. Purnendu Chatterjee, Chairman & CEO, The Chatterjee Group and a senior scholar of JBNSTS (1966) is the Chairman of JBNSTS.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To identify talented students at a young age who will emerge as scientists, technologists and doctors of very high abilities in the future and become the "builders of modern India".
- To nurture them through enrichment programs to develop their talents.
- To motivate students to realize the importance of excellence in the scientific world and educate them to cultivate this goal in real life as students of science.
- Conserve scientific talent with a view to provide for the nation's need for science and technology personnel.

PRESENT ACTIVITIES

Financed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, the functions of JBNSTS were primarily limited to West Bengal only. However, from the early 90's, it started to spread its activities to the neighboring 12 states of Eastern and Northeastern Region. Presently, JBNSTS is engaged in a number of projects in collaboration with different departments of State Govt. as well as the central govt. A brief detail of the programs is given hereunder:

Programs undertaken by JBNSTS in collaboration with Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal

a) Senior Scholarship Scheme

This is the core program of JBNSTS. Since the inception of this organization, this program has remained at the center of all the activities. Under this scheme, the undergraduate students of Pure Science, Medicine and Engineering appear in a multiphase selection procedure and those who are selected are awarded this prestigious scholarship. The selected scholars are motivated and nurtured throughout their M.Sc./ M.B.B.S./ B.E./ B.Tech. level. JBNSTS has a very luminous list of scholars. Almost all the scholars occupy very high positions in their field of works.

The students, who passed Higher Secondary examination or its equivalent in 2010, appeared in the written test on September 26, 2010. A total of 714 students applied for the test in 11 centers in West Bengal. On the basis of merit, 124 students were called for the interview and 66 students among them were selected for Scientific Creativity Test. Finally, 37 students were selected for this prestigious award. The selected scholars get a monthly scholarship of Rs.1,000/- and book grant of Rs.1000/- per year during the period of the scholarship. Besides, they are invited to take part in various follow-up programs like seminars, talent enrichment programs, and educational tours, project works etc. The selected scholars of JBNSTS who are studying pure science at undergraduate level are automatically entitled to the scholarship given by Department of Science & Technology (DST), Govt. of India The value of the scholarship is Rs 80,000 p.a.

b) West Bengal District Scheme

The main focus of this program is on the underprivileged but meritorious students of remote areas of the State. This year JBNSTS has focused on Cooch Behar, Birbhum, Nadia, Hooghly and Burdwan. A number of science workshops were organized in different schools for the students of those areas. It gives a great opportunity to the students of those areas to get an exposure to the world of science and interact with experts from different fields of science.

Under this program, residential and non-residential science workshops are organized in the districts for students of Class VIII and IX for 3 to 4 days. About 70 - 75 students nominated by the schools of a particular area and accompanying science teachers from each school take part in these workshops. The workshops consist of both theory and practical lessons and also outdoor assignments not included in the school syllabus. The participating students are exposed to the exciting and advanced areas of science, which are basic to the understanding of the core concept of the subjects. They are also encouraged to develop self learning through self exploration. It is an excellent opportunity for the young students to understand the basic areas of science as well as the global character of scientific activities.

c) West Bengal Association for Science & Technology (WAST)

West Bengal Academy of Science and Technology (WAST) has planned Teachers' Training Program as well as Students' Workshop at Bankura and Purulia with the collaboration of JBNSTS and DC-SAPI under the coordination of JBNSTS in annual basis. The program is sponsored by Department of Science and Technology, Government of West Bengal. The objectives are to create science awareness and building scientific temper among the teachers and the students of Bankura and Purulia. For the first year JBNSTS organized the following programs for 150 students and 40 teachers from each of the mentioned districts :

- One preliminary Teachers Training program in each district.
- One advanced Training Program with the same teachers at Kolkata from those 2 districts.
- Two students' workshops for each district.

Programs undertaken by JBNSTS in collaboration with Dept. of Science & Technology, Govt. of West Bengal

d) Teachers' Training Program for Middle School Science Teachers of West Bengal

Since 2004, initially with support from Sir Ratan Tata Trust, Mumbai and subsequently support from Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of West Bengal, several Teachers' Training Programs have been conducted with middle school science teachers to motivate teachers towards improved teaching methodologies in science. This is a program for "Innovative Science Teaching" for middle school science teachers of West Bengal, and has entered the 4th year of operation. 5 Districts and Kolkata have come under the ambit of this project and several groups of motivates middle school science teacher have been trained.

OTHER PROGRAMS OF JBNSTS INVOLVING 12 OTHER STATES SUPPORTED BY CENTRAL GOVT. DEPARTMENT

a) Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Government of India

The **Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Government of India** has been contributing to the talent enrichment of selected scholars since 1962 and has in the past few years extended its support to JBNSTS to cater to undergraduate science students from Bihar, Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh. Under this program, the selected scholars of JBNSTS and 1st year undergraduate science students from the mentioned states are taken to different research/educational institutes for educational visit. They also visit research laboratories under CSIR wherever possible.

b) Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India

Since 1999, **Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India** ,has been contributing to a range of Contact Programs for undergraduate science students of the Northeastern States as well as students from Bihar, Orissa, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh. Under this program, science workshops are organized for undergraduate science students of mentioned neighboring states

Activities under the SEATS INSPIRE Scheme

Department of Science & Technology, Government of India has started a very innovative program called "Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research" or "INSPIRE". The basic objective of INSPIRE is to attract talented students to the study of science at an early stage and help to build the required critical human resource pool for strengthening and expanding the study of science and technology and consequently develop research and development base. Under this INSPIRE program, a very important component is the "Scheme for Early Attraction of Talents for Science" or "SEATS". It aims to attract young talented students of higher secondary level through summer/winter camps for them in various locations for top performers in Class X Board Examinations.

DSTFIST Program

A major effort by the Government of India is being made to understand, support and encourage the study of science in the northeastern region. As a part of this, Department of Science & Technology, Government of India has introduced a program "Fund for Improvement in Science & Technology (FIST)" for infrastructural support to various Universities/ institutions in NE States as well as fellowships for faculties/experts and postgraduate science students. JBNSTS has been nominated to act as the nodal agency for managing this program including the disbursement of fellowships to the participants. Fellowships are under the following categories :

• Visiting professor / faculty to NER: Professor / Faculties of the level of Associate Professor or equivalent from reputed institutions from other parts of the country shall visit

one university / institute for one month. They shall share knowledge and experience with the students / faculties of the NE Institute.

- Visiting professor / faculty from NER: Professors / Faculties from universities / institutions from NE region shall visit one university / institute for one month at other parts of the country. They shall gather knowledge and experience from there and share the same on his return at his/her own institute.
- Visiting students from NER: The selected students of NE universities/institutions shall visit one university/institute for three months at other parts of the country. They shall take part in research and other academic activities during their stay.

c) Department of Development of North-Eastern Region (DoNER)

A project was undertaken with the financial assistance from Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) to motivate, identify and nurture young talented students of science of all the Northeastern States namely Assam, Tripura, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Meghalaya and Sikkim. Under this scheme, science workshops were organized to motivate the school students to pursue science as their future career selected students were also given scholarships and nurtured during their period of study. This program has been discontinued since April 2009 due to a change in policy of the Ministry of Development of North-Eastern region.

During 2010-2011 - This is the year when all of us all over the world have been celebrating with great devotion the momentous occasion of the 175th Birth Anniversary of the Master, Sri Ramakrishna, (1836-1886), an 'Incarnation for the Modern Age.

The Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture, one of the main branch centers of Ramakrishna Mission with Headquarters at Belur Math, Howrah, West Bengal, presently located at Gol Park, in South Kolkata has always striven for upgrading the cultural values through the dissemination of the basic teachings of Vedanta as interpreted by Sri Ramakrishna and Swami Vivekananda and demonstrated through their divine lives and teachings. The Foundation Day Oration was delivered by Dr. Bikash Sinha, Homi Bhabha Professor, Department of Atomic Energy and Former Director, Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics & Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre, Government of India on Witnessing the infant Universe at the large Hadron Collider (LHC), Geneva.

Anniversary Celebration of Sri Sri Thakur, Sri Sri Ma & Swamiji

To mark the 147th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, a Grand Music Festival on 12 January 2010 was inaugurated by Swami Sarvabhutananda. As in previous years, this year too the Institute celebrated birth Anniversaries of Sri Ramakrishna, Sri Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda with a colourful procession followed by a Rally, and function at Nazrul Mancha on February 13, 2011. The function at Nazrul Mancha started with Vedic chanting which was followed by readings from Ramakrishna Kathamrita. The Presidential address was given by Swami Sarvabhutananda.

Cultural Programmes

As a part of the Institute's regular activities for the spread and promotion of knowledge and higher values, the Institute, throughout the year, organized 290 Public functions. Of these, 29 were Public lectures, 123 were scripture-classes and discourses, 105 endowment lectures, 1 music festival, 15 Music Programmes, 6 Documentaries, 3 Seminars (collaboration programmes). The Institute also organized 7 Special programmes to celebrate the Foundation day, Birth Anniversaries, Christmas Eve, and Special Symposium. On 24th December, Christmas Eve was observed in which Father George Ponodath, Rector, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata spoke about the significance of the day.

The Institute also conducted on 18.12.2010 an All-India Elocution Competition on Swami Vivekananda in which there were 442 contestants from various Schools and Colleges. 69 Candidates won prizes.

Library

One of the busiest departments of the Institute is its Library in a well-ventilated, adequately illuminated spacious Reading Room in a computerized environment with the average daily attendance of 1726 readers. The Library is one of the popular and well-serviced libraries in the eastern India. It has three wings General, Children and Junior Sections. The number of books purchased, obtained as gifts and bound periodicals during the year under report was 6160 raising the stock to 249541
(General 225619, Junior 7889, and Children 16033). Three world renowned E-journals consortiums **JSTOR, J-GATE** and **Oxford University Press** were introduced in the Library w.e.f. January, 2010. This has become immensely beneficial to our readers in general.

Value Orientation Programme

To encourage the young people to imbibe the ideal of the Ramakrishna Mission the Institute started a Youth Forum called Vivekananda Study Circle and later another youth wing called Vivekananda Anushilan for a deeper study of the life and philosophy of Swamiji. The Vivekananda Anushilan conducted 24 sessions where average attendance was 70. The Institute in its Value Orientation Programme carried the man-making message of Swamiji to the youth at large through 185 Youth Conferences held in 11 districts of southern part of Bengal in which 33,000 youths participated. Apart from above, 8 district-level Youth Conferences were also held. 5 Teachers' Conference were held in which 1353 teachers participated and 1 Organization Representatives' Conferences held on 18.4.2010 at the Institute where 187 organizations participated. Central Youth Convention was held on 21.11.2010 where 1200 youth delegates and 350 observers participated.

Publications

The monthly **Bulletin** with contributions from eminent scholars was regularly published. The popularity of the **Bulletin** in academic circles, both in India and abroad, is steadily rising. A good number of the Institute's earlier publications were also reprinted.

Museum and Art Gallery

As a cultural ambassador of Indian heritage, the Museum and Art Gallery of the Institute of Culture is a place of interest where education and enjoyment are being provided to the visitors. Its manifold activities are the following it displays diverse forms of Indian culture through its permanent exhibition ; arranges noteworthy annual and other temporary exhibitions ; runs an art school for children and conducted P G Diploma course on 'Appreciation of Indian Art'.

The Museum and Art Gallery possess a good number of antiquities and works of art which are categorized as painting, sculpture, manuscript, folk art, ivory painting, textile, pata painting, litho print, silver ornament, terracotta and laminated photograph. There are altogether 1335 art objects in its collection.

To enrich collection, the authorities of the Museum and Art Gallery accept gifts of antique value from sympathizers. During the year, identification of 80 terracotta and stone artifacts (gifted by Dr. Pran G Paul, Amsterdam, Holland) was completed. On 19 August, 2010, Swami Sarvabhutananda released a 'Catalogue of Antiquities' on the aforesaid artifacts. With this prestigious catalogue, Institute Museum has entered in the wider domain of the Museum movement of India.

As per advice of Dr. O P Agrawal, the Director General, INTACH, Lucknow was consulted in the matter and conservation and restoration of a few textile items were entrusted to INTACH, who are specialized in doing such intricate job.

This year, 4 fragile sculptures and relief works of late artist Pramatha Nath Mullick have been transferred into Bronze.

During the year, the Museum and Art Gallery has organized three exhibitions viz, Annual Exhibition of the Museum and Art Gallery, Annual of the Sarada Devi School of Fine Arts and Crafts for Children and two Temporary Exhibitions.

The Department of Museum and Art Gallery conducted a 10-month Post Graduate Diploma Course on 'Appreciation of Indian Art'. The course comprised 75 modules and was affiliated to Kavi Kulaguru Kalidas Sanskrit Visvavidyalaya, Nagpur. More than thirty art historians, art critics, artists and museologists are attached as faculty members in the course. On Monday, 9 August, 2010, the inaugural ceremony for the academic session 2010-2011 was held at Turiyananda Hall. Dr. Satchidananda Dhar, formerly Principal, Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya, Tripura inaugurated the Course. In the current academic session, 45 students have been enrolled.

Number of visitors to the Museum and Art Gallery during the year was approximately 3500.

Centre for Indological Studies and Research

In pursuance of the objective that research is the inherent and continuous activity of this Institute, the Centre for Indological Studies and Research carried on, during the year under Report, Research work with scholars of the country and abroad. Some scholars obtained doctoral and post doctoral degrees while some fresh scholars have also joined.

There are 11 pre-doctoral, 5 post-doctoral and 6 Research fellows and project scholars in the Centre working in various projects. The total number of Research Professors and Visiting Professors associated with the CISR is 20.

Like previous years, the CISR conducted courses in Indology, Functional Sanskrit, Appreciation of Indian Art, Major Religions of the World, Ramakrishna Vivekananda Movement, Main Tenets of Advaita Vedanta,

Higher Vedanta and Some Fundamental Concepts of Indian Philosophy. A UNESCO approved course on 'International Understanding for Human Unity' is also being run by the Centre.

A few students from abroad joined as students in Indology, IUHU and Sanskrit. To promote intercultural understanding further, foreign scholars have also been interacting with the Indology students.

The Convocation of these courses of the CISR was held on 24 September 2010 at Shivananda Hall. Prof. Sabyasachi Bhattacharya, Chairman, Indian Council of Historical Research, delivered the convocation address and Dr. Karuna Sindhu Das, Vice-Chancellor, Rabindra Bharati University, presided. Apart from two pre research scholars who successfully completed their researches, 22 students received awards.

The CISR organized a 3-day International Seminar on 'Spirituality and Science of Consciousness' from 8 to 10 January, a National Seminar on 'Remembering the Pundits of Eastern India' in collaboration with ICPR from 12 to 14 November and a Workshop on 'Creativity in Education' on 27-28 November 2010.

The programme titled International Understanding for Human Unity completed the fifth year since its launching in September 2005. The other thing is the lasting impact of this programme on the participants. Those of the previous four years have formed a voluntary association now a registered body. It sports a significant name "WE" the Forum for Human Unity. There are 49 students enrolled in the current session. The Convocation of the fifty batch of students of UNESCO approved advanced course in *International Understanding for Human Unity* was held on July 30, 2010. The Convocation Address was delivered by Hon'ble Justice Chittatosh Mookerjee. Swami Atmapriyananda, Vice-Chancellor, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University gave away the prizes.

A new forum for popularization of science and scientific temper named *Vivekananda Science Circle* has been initiated since July 2010 to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. The Circle meets once every month where eminent scientists from different fields initiate discussions on various scientific issues.

Since its establishment in 1995 **Vivekananda Archive** has been engaged in the collection of all kinds of materials, specially publications in all languages Indian and foreign (i) on Sri Ramakrishna, the Holy Mother, Swami Vivekananda and his brother disciples, sannayasins of the Ramakrishna Order and other personalities related to the Ramakrishna-Vivekananda Movement. (ii) Thoughts and ideas expressed in Swamiji's work (iii) Reference to the personality of Swamiji in the Western press and also help research scholars working on the same subject. With a bigger space the Archive has widened its activities. It has added to its Library a number of books etc.

School of Languages

The School of Languages is a major wing and centre of activities of the Institute. During the year the school taught 19 languages : 5 Indian (Bengali, Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil and Urdu) 4 foreign (Ancient Greek, Arabic, Chinese, English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Latin, Persian, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish). The total enrolment in 2010 was 20,317. English language accounted for 88.91% of the total enrolment.

A six month course each in Communicative Korean and Communicative Russian was started in January and July 2010 respectively. A one-year course in Ancient Greek was started in July 2010.

The Tulsi-Beena Goswami Debate Competition was held on September 25, 2010. The topic was 'In the opinion of the House, India has not taken adequate steps to arrest global warming.' 49 students participated in the debate.

Educational Assistance

During the period under Report, with the income from endowments created by the donors the Institute gave a large number of scholarships and stipends to needy but meritorious students. Besides, 4 scholarships of Rs. 1,00,000/- each for higher studies abroad were awarded to 4 scholars through Debesh-Kamal scholarship and a few more scholarships to medical students in West Bengal. The total educational assistance rendered by the Institute during the year amounts to Rs. 19,34,500/-.

Charitable Work among Slum Children

During the year under Report the Institute served 1 (one) liter milk and 200 gm. bread everyday to poor children up to 6 years of age. They were given Puja garments and winter blankets. Besides, 600 pieces of blankets were given to the poor and old destitute during Winter.

International House

During the year under report 1,189 guests stayed at this International House. Besides, 770 guests came from various parts of India. Others came from countries like U.S.A., U.K., Germany, Canada, Japan, Australia, Bangladesh, China, Korea, Italy, Malaysia, Netherlands, Russia, Singapore, Thailand etc.

The Institute is devoted to the study of social and economic problems of India, past and present. Prof. Suranjan Das, Vice-Chancellor, Calcutta University is the President, Dr. Subir Banerjee is the present Secretary and Prof. Subhas Dutta, Mr. Jahar Sen are the Joint Secretary of the organisation.

The ongoing research projects of the Institute are the following :

1. Pre-Census Population Project of India sponsored by the Planning Commission and the Registrar General, India

The purpose of the project is to compile and publish descriptive and statistical materials on any part of India — Provinces, districts, cities, towns, taluks, thanas, villages from the ancient period to 1870 when the first census was conducted. It is proposed to publish 8 volumes, one volume for the period up to 1800, and one for each decade from 1801 to 1870. Four volumes relating to the period 1801-1840 have been published by the Registrar General, India. The manuscripts for Volume VI (1841-1850) and Volume VII (1851-1860) is ready for publication by the Registrar General India.

2. Title of the Project

BHARAT SANDHAN, Rammohun theke Rabindranath Quest for a New India, From Rammohun to Tagore :

Aim of this project is to assess / estimate the emergence of conception of being Indian, including all out zeal and effort towards construction of new integrated India irrespective of caste, creed or religion that has evolved since the days of Rammohun, the first Renascent man in the history of Modern India. The topic of discussion has included phase-wise thoughts and works of Rammohun, Debendranath, Vidyasagar, Keshab Chandra, Shibnath Shastri, Ramkrishna Vivekananda, Aswini Kumar Dutta, Aurobindo and particularly of Rabindranath Tagore with reflections of the historical development of our mind looking at the confluence of feeling for a new India and modernization. The discussion hints at also, though in a nutshell at the aspirations and complicacies of our hurdles in respect of casteism and communalism, calamities or devastation resultant upon hatred and carnage of neighbours, the ultimate message of renascent India remain unaltered.

The discussion has highlighted all these aspects from historical points of view aiming simultaneously to substantiate also that in spite of the crude presence or massive resistance of communalism and parochialism quest for an enlightened India enriched with universal values has never been dislocated or gone out of the track till now. That is perhaps the most glorious output of the great representatives of awakened India.

3. SERI also observed Golden Jubilee Programme in 2010 in the humble way. In this context, a Bulletin of the Socio-Economic Research Institute was published. This Bulletin was a special volume which was edited by an emident scholar and Professor Atindra Mohan Gun. This volume was formally opened by Prof. Sitanshu Mukherjee, Ex-President of SERI, Ex-Vice-Chancellor, Kalyani University.

The Samsad Since, the Vedic tradition is the ever lasting tradition of India even the torrent of time couldn't erase it, so, the contemporary approach, provisions are inevitable; consequently the Samsad which was founded in 1986 and registered under West Bengal Societies Registration Act, is in action to sustain and boost the tradition up Sanskrit & Vedic learning from last 25 years. It is recognized by the Government of West Bengal and the Government of India and is receiving grants from both the Governments. Stealthily it is progressing towards attaining the status of centre of excellence. With the view of achieve its aforesaid objectives, the Samsad undertook following activities during the tenure of '2010-2011'.

Academic Activities :

As in previous years, this year also Samsad held its own Examination at Kolkata on December 12-15, 2010, in 'Adya', 'Madhya' and 'Upadhi' in accordance with the syllabus drawn by the topmost scholars in the country. The Examinations evoked keen interest and as many as 750 candidates from various districts appeared in the said examination.  Mahasveta Devi(a National Professor) and Mr. Jyotiska Ranjan Sarkar (a Research Scholar).
- (vii) Translation of Kavyadarsha and Sahitya Darpan

The Samsad has already completed some of the above projects and is carrying on with the rest in a most satisfactory manner.

The Institute of Development Studies Kolkata (IDSK) has been promoted by the Government of West Bengal as an autonomous centre of excellence in social sciences. It was founded in 2002 as a society with an autonomous governing body, with one of the most eminent historians in India, Professor Irfan Habib as President, Professor Amiya Kumar Bagchi as Director and with a Governing Council on which are represented the current or former Vice-Chancellors of two leading Universities in West Bengal, namely Calcutta University and Jadavpur University. The new Governing Council constituted in 2010 includes such eminent academics.

The IDSK is devoted to advanced academic research and informed policy advice in the areas of literacy, education, health, gender issues, employment, technology, communication, human sciences and economic development. Other programmes include training of research scholars in the social sciences working towards a Ph.D.

The IDSK is now in the ninth year of its existence. Its main campus at 27/D, DD Block, Salt Lake was ready by July 2010 and most of its activities have been gradually shifted to that campus. It has actively collaborated with the departments of history, economics, political science, philosophy, business management, the Science College, and the Centre for Urban Economic Studies, Women's Studies Research Centre, and the Centre for Social Sciences and Humanities, of the University of Calcutta. The Institute has also organized a number of training and research programmes, generally in collaboration with other academic institutions, the details of which have been given in the body of the report.

The University Grants Commission(UGC) has sponsored the setting up of the Rabindranath Tagore Centre for Human Development Studies(RTCHDS) under the auspices of the IDSK, through the University of Calcutta. An Advisory Committee has been constituted with the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Calcutta as Chairman, the Director of IDSK as Vice-Chairman and with other representatives from the IDSK and the University of Calcutta.

During the year the IDSK celebrate the 150th birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore.

In 2010, the RTCHDS in collaboration with the Eastern Zonal Cultural Centre organized a workshop on *Reception of R.N. Tagore in North Eastern Region of India* on 3 and 4 September.

The RTCHDS in collaboration with the Department of English, University of Calcutta organized a three-day conference on *Tagore: At Home in the World* between 10 and 12 February 2011.

I Research Programmes

A. The programme on 'Improving health status of women in rural West Bengal' funded by the Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung, Berlin

The project on **Improving health status of women in rural West Bengal** sponsored by the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation, Berlin and implemented by the scholars of IDSK in 2010 aims to assess the change in the level of reproductive and non-reproductive morbidity and associated treatment seeking behavior among women aged 13-49 years in two Gram Panchayats of the Md. Bazar Block of Birbhum district by using experimental design framework. The baseline survey was conducted during June, 2010 to September, 2010. The intervention activities are conducted by the Rural Health Care Providers (RHCPs) who were earlier trained by the Liver Foundation.

B. The project on 'Documents on the Economic History of British Rule in India 1858-1947'

A second volume containing documents related to Eastern India during the 1880s and 1890s has been published by Manohar in 2011. The third volume, containing documents relating to Madras Presidency under British Rule during the 860s and 1870s is expected to be sent to the ICHR soon.

C. A Study Report on Mid Term Appraisal of the 11th Five Year Plan of West Bengal

The final draft of the Report has been submitted to the Planning Commission on 28 December 2010.

D. A Study Report on Mid Term Appraisal of the 11th Five Year Plan of Tripura

The Planning Commission, Government of India assigned to the Institute of Development Studies Kolkata the task of preparing a Report on the performance of monitorable targets and flagship programmes for Mid Term Appraisal of the 11th Five Year Plan of Tripura.

E. Evaluation of the Training Programme for Rural Health Care

The major objectives of the current evaluation study are (i) to assess what extent the training programme has achieved its stated objective; and (ii) suggest ways to improve the weak areas of the training programme. The evaluation study adopts a quasi randomised case-control design and covers 18 Gram Panchayats in three blocks of Birbhum. The evaluation study which started in July 2010 is expected to be completed by November 2011.

F. A Study of the Disability Movement in India: Trajectory, Tensions, Future

The primary aim of this study is to examine and explore the ways in which the local/regional/ national struggles of groups of persons with disabilities is taking the shape of a social movement that seeks to alter the ways in which disabled people are viewed and treated by the society at large. The research study proposes to examine the different strands of the localized disability advocacy struggles in various parts of the country in order to gain a better and contextualised understanding of the key issues, important events and strategies being used to carve out a disability rights movement, based on development of collective identity for all persons with disability.

The objectives of the research are:

(i) To gain a deeper understanding of the processes through which alliances of persons with disabilities are being forged at the local levels the reasons and ways in which

agencies are promoting formation of disabled people's organizations at the grassroots level, the reasons why disabled people are forming groups, and the ways in which they are organizing themselves.

- (ii) To explore the processes by which the groups are identifying key issues as concerns for their advocacy, the strategies used by these groups to negotiate the major challenges they face in terms of inclusion in the community in terms of education, health and livelihood as well as in other domains of social life.
- (iii) To evaluate the extent of impact the efforts of these groups has had on the lives of persons with disabilities in terms of changes in structures, systems and processes, and to determine their role in stimulating the disability rights movement at the local, regional and national level.
- (iv) To gain a deeper understanding of the processes of identity formation and reinforcement of certain identity markers for persons with disabilities brought about by the participation in the groups and in the larger movement.

G. Planning and Implementation of Intervention Programmes under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan

In response to requests from Secretary, School Education Department, and State Project Director, PBSS the IDSK has taken up the responsibility of guiding the district project offices in three districts, viz. Murshidabad, Birbhum, Hooghly and Nadia, at various stages of planning and implementation of the programmes pertaining to elementary education with the aim of achieving the goals of the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan. The tasks undertaken are: (i) Preparation of annual work plan at the district level based on an assessment of the past trends in various indicators, identification of problem areas and a thorough analysis of the resource gaps, where resources include not only financial but also physical and human; (ii) Quarterly review of progress by making rapid appraisal of a select number of schools once in each quarter; (iii) Holding meetings with stakeholders; (iv) Review the design and implementation of teachers' training programmes; (v) Documenting best practices and disseminating ideas. The project ends on March 31, 2011.

H. Pre-Service and In-Service Training of School Teachers in West Bengal: Current Status and Planning for the Future

In response to the request from Secretary, School Education Department, the Institute of Development Studies Kolkata undertook a study on Pre-Service and In-Service Training of School Teachers in West Bengal. Given the stipulation of the RTE Act that teachers at the

elementary level (Class I to VIII) must have the requisite training, there is now an enormous need for training of untrained teachers in West Bengal in order to comply with the Act. We prepare a detailed quantitative assessment of the existing facilities vis-à-vis the projected requirement and suggest ways to plan for future.

I. The Project on "History of Girls' Schooling and Education in Bengal: 1900-1950"

The IDSK has undertaken a research project on **History of Girls' Schooling and Education in Bengal: 1900-1950** to commemorate Begum Rokeya's pioneering efforts to advance women's education begun a hundred years ago in this city. As a part of this project, the IDSK has selected eight girls' schools of Kolkata, for recording their history. II Collaborations

a. Collaboration with the University of Calcutta

The first three batches of M.Phil students (2006-08, 2007-09 and 2008-10) successfully completed their course and obtained their degrees. The fourth batch is busy in completing their dissertations and the fifth batch is doing their coursework. The teaching faculty mainly consists of the IDSK faculty and the University faculty associated with CSSH.

b. Collaboration with South Asia Institute (SAI), University of Heidelberg, Germany

A collaborative agreement has been made between IDSK and SAI, University of Heidelberg, Germany.

c. Collaboration with Monash Asia Institute, Monash University, Australia

An international workshop was organized by IDSK on 'Comparative Community Based Forestry Management in Response to Climate Change' on 20 and 21 September, 2010 and another workshop on 'Community Development in the Ganga Basin in Response to Climate Change'

was held on 22 and 23 September 2010. A Memorandum of Understanding between the IDSK and the Faculty of Arts, Monash Asia Institute has also been signed in February 2011.

d. Collaboration with Swiss Network for International Studies (SNIS)

A Memorandum of Understanding between the IDSK and the Swiss Network for International Studies (SNIS) has been signed for carrying out a project on 'Migration, scientific diasporas and development: Impact of skilled return migration on development in India'. This project will commence in the last week of February or first week of March 2011.

The **Library**, which began functioning from December 2002, already houses an impressive number of books, journals and magazines and primary documents focusing on various

development research like Education, Public Health, Economics, Sociology, Political Sciences, Gender Studies, Human Sciences and Globalization. It has a total collection of 10969 (processed) books till 14 February 2010. The library also subscribes to 42 foreign and 35 Indian journals, 712 government and 134 non-government reports. It has 294 digital documents. The library also contains the archives of Rosa Luxemburg projects which include reports, booklets, posters, pats or scroll paintings, CDs, DVDs, audio cassettes, catalogues, transparencies and fact sheets. The library acquired 1997 books and 5 foreign journals for Rabindranath Tagore Centre for Human Development Studies.

Bangiya Sahitya: Parisad was established in the year 1893. The then many great personalities of Bengal like Rabindranath Tagore, Ramesh Chandra Dutt, Ramendra Sundar Tribedi, Dwijendranath Tagore, Benoy Krishna Deb Bahadur, Satyendranath Tagore etc. were associated with this esteemed institution. The library section of Bangiya Sahitya Parisad library contains almost 2.5 lack valuable books and periodicals. Most of which are rare and 18th and 19th century's publication. The manuscript Department of Bangiya Sahitya Parisad enriched with approx. 8,000 rare manuscripts. Apart from that, it also has its own publications department.
